City Clerk was instructed to ascertain when commission of present City Supervisor of Elections expired and inform Council.

resignations of T. O. S. Dibble, Chief of Fire Department and W. G. Inabinet, Assistant Chief of Fire Department to take effect on Midnight April 30, 1915 were accepted by following vote

City Clerk Dibble was allowed leave of absence Tuesday May 18th for the purpose of attending the sessions of State firemen's Association at Greenwood S.C.

At request of Town of Denmark, City Electrician J. E. Salley was permitted to visit said Town and assist in the adjustment of matters pertaining to their Electric Light Plant, Denmark to assume railroad fare and other expenses incurred, but no charge to be made for Mr. Salley's time.

Reading of financial statement for month of April was postponed on account of absence of Mr. W. H. Rosseau who was acting City Clerk at that time and who was to prepare same.

City Clerk read a letter from Capt F. F. Pooser of the Tilman Volunteers requesting an adjustment of an over charge as he claimed of water bill for quarter ending March 31, 1915. A written statement of readings of this meter for term referred to was submitted by Supt. Salley of the Water and Light Department, showing that the amount of water charged had passed through the meter. He also suggested verbally that there was a bad leak in Toilet and he supposed that loss of water was from this source.

City Clerk was instructed to communicate with Capt Pooser and advise him that after thorough examination by proper officials of Water and Light Department that they had found readings to be correct, and that no reduction would be allowed from bill as rendered.

An election was entered upon for the purpose of filling vacancies on the Board of Firemasters caused by the resignation of Chief T. O. S. Dibble and Assistant Chief W. G. Inabinet.

For this purpose City Council met in joint session with ranking officers of the four companies composing the Orangeburg fire department as follows:-

The Mayor announced nominations in order for Chief of Fire Department. Dr. T. A. Jeffords from the East End Reel Company nominated Assistant Chief James P. Doyle. Mr. Joe Marcus from the Young Americas nominated Mr. James Izlar Sims. There being no further nominations The Mayor appointed Messrs O. W. Spahr, Walter O' Cain and Joe Marcus tellers

and ballot was proceeded with, resulting in following vote.

Asst. Chief Doyle received 8 votes

Mr. Sims received 2 votes.

Assistant Chief James P. Doyle was declared elected to the office of Chief of the Orangeburg Fire Department.

The joint session then proceeded to elect two Assistant Chiefs of Fire Department to fill vacancies occasioned by the resignation of Assistant Chief W.G. Inabinet and the promotion of Assistant Chief James P. Doyle. Mr. Spahr nominated Mr. James Izlar Sims and Mr. O'Cain nominated Mr. Frank F. Dukes there being no further nominations these gentlemen were elected by acclamation.

The joint session was then dissolved by the Mayor.

In the matter of inviting the South Carolina State Firemen's Association to hold their Annual Meeting for 1916 at the City of Orangeburg, City Clerk read a letter from Mr. Luther Ellison giving information as to expense attached to the entertainment of this body which was received as information and no action taken at this meeting.

Mr. Edward Hawes Jr. having paid to City Treasurer balance of Forty Dollars-\$40.00- due by him on account of purchase money of lot on Corner Seaboard Avenue and Bull streets, following resolution was passed authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute a Deed of Conveyance to said Edward Hawes, Jr of said property, by following vote



WHEREAS on the twenty sixth day of May A. D. 1915, a majority of the freeholders of the City of Orangeburg, South Carolina, as shown by the Tax Books of said City did file with THE CITY COUNCIL OF ORANGEBURG their petitions asking that the City Council of Orangeburg Order a special election, as required by law, at which election shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said City of Orangeburg the question: "Shall the City of Orangeburg, S. C., for the purpose of enlarging and extending its Waterworks and Water Works Plant, issue Coupon Bonds as provided by law, to the amount of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, or so much thereof as may be legally issued by said City, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum per annum payable semi-annually?"

And that the said City Council of Orangeburg ~~xxxxxxx~~ also submit to the qualified electors of said City of Orangeburg at a special election the question: "Shall the City of Orangeburg, S. C., for the purpose of enlarging and extending its Electric Light Plant, issue Coupon Bonds, as provided by law, to the amount of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, or so much thereof as may be legally issued by said City, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually?"

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDAINED by the City Council of Orangeburg South Carolina, in regular council assembled, pursuant to said petitions and as required by law That a Special Election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held at the City Hall, in the City and County of Orangeburg in said State, on *Tuesday* the *twenty ninth* day of June A. D. 1915, at which election shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said City of Orangeburg the questions:

" Shall the City of Orangeburg S. C., for the purpose of enlarging and extending its waterworks and waterworks Plant, issue Coupon Bonds, as provided by law, to the amount of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, or so much thereof as may be legally issued by said City, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually?"

And also the question shall be submitted at said election:

" Shall the City of Orangeburg, S. C., for the purpose of enlarging and extending its Electric Light Plant, issue Coupon Bonds as provided by law, to the amount of Fifteen Thousand Dollars, or so much thereof as may be legally issued by said City, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually?"

And said questions shall be voted on separately by the qualified Electors at said election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF ORANGEBURG That those qualified electors of said City voting at said election who are in favor of issuing said Bonds shall vote: Yes, In favor of Bonds." and that those qualified electors of said City who

voting at said election, who are opposed to issuing said Bonds, shall vote: "No, Against Bonds."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF ORANGE-  
BURG That, for the purposes of said election, Books of Registration be  
opened by the Supervisor of Registration of said City, twenty days before  
the day fixed for said election, and that said Books of Registration be  
kept open ten days in said City, for the purpose of registering all  
persons qualified to register in said City as provided by law; and that  
the said Supervisor of Registration of said City do publish due notice  
of the time and place of the opening of said Books of Registration.

Shall The City of Orangeburg S.C. for the purpose of enlarging and extending its water works, and water works plant, issue coupon bonds as provided by law to the amount of fifteen thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be legally issued by the city, bearing interest at the rate of five percentum per annum, payable semi-annually?

And also the question:- Shall the city of Orangeburg S.C. for the purpose of enlarging and extending its Electric Light Plant, issue coupon bonds as provided by law, to the amount of Fifteen Thousand dollars or so much thereof as may legally be issued by said City, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable Semi-Annually?

Councilman Von Ohsen offered the following resolution.

Resolved that an election be ordered that qualified voters of the city of Orangeburg S.C. be privileged to vote on said question of issuing Coupon bonds as prayed in said petitions, said election to be held on the twenty ninth day of June A.D. 1915, at City Hall, in the City of Orangeburg, County of Orangeburg and State of South Carolina.

This resolution was passed. The Mayor and councilman Von Ohsen each voting "yea".

City Attorney Glaze was instructed to proceed with necessary arrangements for said election.

Recess was then taken to Wednesday June 2, 1915.

June 2, 1915. Business of Council resumed.

Mr. H. S. Mr. Heggy's proposition was received as information and action on same deferred.

Mr. William C. Wolfe, President of the Orangeburg Railroad requested that City remit one-half of license charged against his Railroad as has been done in the past. Upon motion a resolution was passed that City Clerk and Treasurer be instructed to collect full License due the City by the Orangeburg Railroad with penalty amounting to \$165.00 and return to Said Railroad one half of this amount, namely \$82.50. At meeting of City Council held October 8 Th. the Chief of Fire Dept, and City Engineer were instructed to investigate the property No.27 North Middleton Street, located in Fire district No.1 , belonging to Mr. C.A.Stroman .

Mr.Stroman proposes to rent this particular store to one Arthur Hynes to construct and operate a moving picture theatre. Upon investigation of the premises we find that the building proper is a two story brick structure, as it is proposed to have theatre on ground floor, and to cut out the present 13" brick wall in rear of said store from floor level of first floor to the ceiling, and support second floor of said wall with 2-ten inch " I " beams. Directly in the rear of this wall is a wooden blacksmith shop 23 feet in depth, a portion of this shop is covered with an open wooden porch, and a galv.iron roof.

The proposed stage of said theatre is to be located in this wooden blacksmith shop.

In this connection I wish to say that after the removal of the old roof the brick of the reservoir walls at the top was found to be in very bad condition which necessitated the knocking down for five courses and re-laying in cement in order that this wall should prevent the entrance of insects into the reservoir. This work ran up the cost of sand and cement more than had been estimated and the labor to almost twice the estimated cost due to the fact that the brick removed from the wall were cleaned and re-layed.

I wish to say also that the labor cost above, covers the removal of the old roof, the cleaning and washing of the reservoir as well as the construction of the new roof.


Work that was done on switch board and on other apparatus in the plant that had to be done when sections of the plant had to be shut down was carried on by the regular force of the plant during spare time and on Sundays with material on hand and without extra cost to the plant.

I would like to say that this work was discussed with Councilman VonOhlsen from time to time and his approval obtained before proceeding.

I would like to say, also, that while some of these items cost slightly more than was estimated and others considerably less, this was to be expected in work of this character and every effort was made to keep down the cost and at the same time get the plant in shape to take us safely through the heavy load ~~xxx~~ season before us.

The Street light regulators purchased at a cost of \$448.00 at factory was in the face of quotations from two of the largest electrical manufacturers in the country of \$684.00 and \$761.00 for regulators of the same size and class.



Mr Howard Butt his only competitor having given his consent Councilman Felder moved that the Bid of the Walsh & Weidner Boiler Company be opened and considered along with bid of The Babcock & Wilcox Boiler Co.

Council gave attention to messrs Collier & Butt who discussed the merits of boilers and smoke stacks in interest of manufacturers that they represented and after giving full and free hearing to each party and discussing among themselves the relative value of what these gentlemen had to offer, following resolution was offered by Councilman Felder:-

It was moved that side track to New Water & Light Plant be started at South side as indicated by Mr. Wolfe. Carried


