AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE LICENSES IN THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING APRIL 1,1920 AND ENDING MARCH 31,1921 passed 1st reading by following vote:-

City Clerk and Treasurer was authorized to settle account General Fire Extinguisher Company on account of piping System installed by them in connection with the installation of new Turbine at Water and Light Plant,which amounts to \$3.322.62 which is 90 % of contract , by following vote,

Yea The Mayor,Councilmen Watson and Sifly.

Communication from Jr.Order United American Mechanics offering to furnish City with a flag to be raised each morning and lowered each afternoon ~~from~~ flag pole located at Court House by someone designated by City,was submitted to Council and offer was accepted and City Clerk was instructed to convey to them thanks of City for their patriotic offer and advise that request as to handling of flag will be assumed by City.

Regular Meeting January 9, 1920, continued.

Application Jas. P. Doyle for installation of gasoline tank 1000 gal. capacity on property of Estate P. Doyle, east side of S. Railroad Ave was approved. Tank to be installed in accordance with City Ordinances

Application Mrs Ann Hodson for installation gasoline tank under side walk in front of her place of business No. 51 Sellers Ave. was declined for the reason that same was forbidden by City Ordinance. Applications from Stroman Garage and Orangeburg Coca Cola Co for installation of Gasoline Tanks were postponed because same were not signed by applicants.

The Mayor reported that since last meeting of Council that he had taken up the matter of purchase of hose for use of Fire Department and has purchased same as follows:-

and had signed contracts covering same and asked Council to confirm this necessary expenditure.

Councilman Watson Moved that action of Mayor in purchasing above mentioned hose be confirmed, which motion was carried by following vote:- Yea The Mayor, Councilmen Watson and Sifly.

Upon motion of Councilman Watson Sanitary dues were increased to \$3.00 per year from Jan. 1, 1920, payable 75 cents in advance per quarter.

City Clerk advised Council that according to instructions he had advertised sale of \$200,000 bonds in Manufacturers Record and Daily Bond News, Bids to be opened January 15 1920 and had numerous inquiries relative to same. Received as information.

The Mayor was authorized to borrow from Banks of City at interest not exceeding six percent \$25,000 if so much be needed for use of City, pledging taxes collectable during October 1920 in payment for same, by following vote:-

Mr. J. M. Albergotti in person petitioned Council for Water, Electric and Sewer extensions on Whaley, Mc Alpin and South Broughton Streets. Action on this petition was postponed.

Bids for Street Sweepings and Compost were opened. There was only one bid that of Mr. E. A. Bultman. His bid was \$75.00 as per advertisement, from Jan 1, 1920 to Dec 31, 1920. This bid was accepted by following vote. Yea The Mayor, Councilmen Watson and Sifly.


AN ORDINANCE TO PREVENT USE OF ANY AIR HOSE UPON THE SIDEWALKS

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
A RESOLUTION.

RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg S.C. in Council assembled:-


Section 1 That the Mayor of the City of Orangeburg S.C. be and he is hereby authorized to borrow on the note or notes of the City of Orangeburg S.C., maturing not later than December 1, 1920 executed by the Hon. W.A. Livingston, Mayor, and T.O.S. Dibble City Clerk and Treasurer, bearing interest in advance not exceeding six (6) per centum per annum, the sum of TWENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000) or so much thereof as may be necessary for ordinary City purposes and such other obligations of said City as may now be due and may be incurred by said City, until the taxes for the fiscal year 1920-1921 are received.


Section 2. That the Taxes of said City for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1921, due and payable from the first day of October 1920 to the ninth day of November 1920 are hereby pledged to secure the repayment of amounts so borrowed.



An Ordinance to Amend an Ordinance Adopted December 12, 1919 Relating to the Issuance and Sale of Certain Municipal Bonds by the City of Orangeburg and Making Certain Prescriptions concerning same.

Be it Resolved and ordained by the City Council of the City of Orangeburg, S. C. that an ordinance entitled " An Ordinance Authorizing and Directing the Issuance and Sale of Certain Municipal Coupon Bonds Authorized and Directed to be Issued and Sold by City Council of the City of Orangeburg, S. C. by a Special Municipal Election held by the Qualified Electors of the City of Orangeburg, S. C. on the 4th day of November A. D. 1919 and making Certain Prescriptions Required by law to be made by said City Council." adopted December 12, 1919, be and the same is hereby amended by striking out Section 5 of said ordinance and inserting in lieu thereof the following:


"Section 5.- That for the payment of the interest on the bonds directed to be issued by the ordinance adopted December 12th, 1919, and this ordinance, and for the purpose of creating a sinking fund for the payment and redemption of said bonds at the maturity thereof, City Council of Orangeburg does hereby assess, levy and collect in addition to the annual taxes levied for other purposes, a sufficient annual tax upon the taxable property of the City of Orangeburg, to meet the interest to become due upon said bonds, and also to provide and raise such part of the sinking fund in aid of the retirement and payment of said bonds as it is advisable or necessary to provide and raise annually therefor, and that said taxes be levied and collected annually in the same manner that other taxes of said City are levied and collected; and that the sinking fund created for the payment of each of the issues of said bonds be kept separate and distinct so that at all times the amount of the sinking fund applicable to the payment of each of said issues of bonds may be evident; Provided, the amount set apart as a sinking fund annual-



ly shall not exceed the necessary fractional amount to provide for an aggregate sum sufficient for the retirement of the said bonds on ~~their~~ maturity, and the tax levy therefor shall conform to this provision."

the bonds authorized at an election held the fourth day of  
November, 1919, in the City of Orangeburg, South Carolina,  
forty-five thousand (\$45,000.00) <sup>dollars</sup> thereof (nos. 1 to 45 inclusive)  
being issued for the purpose of enlarging and extending the  
City's electric light plant; forty-five thousand (\$45,000.00)  
dollars thereof (Nos. 46 to 90 inclusive) being issued for the  
purpose of enlarging and extending the City's waterworks;  
ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars thereof (Nos. 91 to 100  
inclusive) being issued for the purpose of enlarging and extending  
the City's sewerage and sewerage system and one hundred thousand  
(\$100,000.00) dollars thereof (Nos. 101 to 200 inclusive) being  
issued for the purpose of paying for permanent improvements on  
the streets of the City of Orangeburg, South Carolina, which  
said bonds have been duly sold to Messrs. Hilsman & Company,

Following resolution relative to application of Southern Bell Tel. & Tel. Co to raise rates was passed.



City Clerk was instructed to advertise for bids for Street Sweepings for year 1921.


