Playground Commission requested to nominate a successor to fill vacancy.

Supt Pearson of Water and Light Plant stated that for the purpose of removing concrete foundation now not in use at Power House and very much in the way of improvements now going on that he had consulted Mr. Russel Wolfe, Dynamite Expert, as to the possibility of using dynamite in breaking up same, and had requested him to be present at this meeting.

Mr. Wolfe stated that he thought use of dynamite using light charges was practical and would not interfere with or damage Turbine or other machinery in power house. Supt Pearson told Council that he was not disposed to assume responsibility while he agreed with Mr. Wolfe and requested Council to take definite action on this matter.

After full discussion Council decide to refer the matter to Councilmen Watson and Superintendent Pearson with power to act and make such arrangements with Mr. Wolfe as deemed requisite by following vote:-

Engineer Hawes stated that the Western Union Tel. Co had requested permission to place 12 poles which they were re-setting on Amelia Street in the park-way of said street and that he had refused to grant permit reporting his action to Council for their approval which was sustained and Council decided that no poles be allowed to be set in parkway on Amelia Street other than those already there by unanimous vote.

Regular meeting January 25, 1924 continued.

Chief of Police instructed to regulate parking of automobiles on West Russel and "orth Droughton Streets as merchants and other business concerns were blocking traffic in parking cars and other vehicles out to far on drive way on these streets.

Councilman Watson was authorized to purchase 1000 feet of hose from Empire Rubber and Tire Company at 1.30 per foot, provided th that Seagrave chassis offered in connection with this purchase proved satisfactory after examination by Chief Fischer and Asst Chief Hall. <sup>any ~~hose~~ truck used by East St. Paul Co. to be given in exchange</sup> terms one year at 6 % interest.; by following vote



The matter of water supply furnished Sunnyside Cemetary for which to date no charge is being made was discussed by Council, after mature consideration it was decided to charge Cemetary for water used at regular rates effective June 1, 1924, and Engineer Hawes who reported to Council that he had refused to grant 4 permits on cemetary main until this matter was settled by Council was authorized to grant permits applied for by following vote:-

Drs C.L.Green and G.M.Truluck were present in interest of meeting of State Medical Association during the month of April, and asked for an appropriation from City Council to assist in expense of entertainment of this body. Council appropriated \$200.00 towards object by following vote:-

Mr.J.D.Slater appeared before Council with the request that Council devise some means whereby transient dealers in horses and mules, who come into Orangeburg on salesdays and other times, selling often very inferior stock, and interfering with regular dealers who are here the year round, paying license and taxes. The Mayor assured Mr.Slater that Council was doing everything in their power, within the law, to handle this matter and protect local dealers and directed City Attorney to investigate as to whether ordinance of City were violated.



Communication of Bamberg Lumber Company stating that they would in the future ship all lumber and would do no retail business hereafter and that on account of said change in their business that they presumed no License for Lumber Yard would be required of them, was read and referred to City Attorney for his opinion. *Ans. Reply*

Mayor stated that Postmaster had mentioned to him the need of numbering a great many houses that were without numbers in order that proper deliveries of mail matter could be made by P/O Department. This matter was referred to City Engineer.

Analysis of water received from State Chemist and Bacteriologist was read and received as information.

Mr. Gus Rich submitted to Council a complaint from some of the butchers of Orangeburg, whose names he did not give, relative to the sale of meats, sausage & pudding and such like articles of food, and asking that sale of such be prohibited when offered in wagons, buggies, stores &c. Mayor advised Mr. Rich that the sale of sausages puddings, fresh meats raised by farmers were allowed when they offered such as were raised by the individual persons offering same for sale. That the sale of such products were permitted under the license ordinance of the City only under such circumstances. otherwise they were required to get the same license that regular Green Grocers were required to take out. That sanitary laws of the State and City were being complied with and all meats sold were inspected by health department before offered for sale.



WHEREAS, by the terms of the said conveyance, the said City of Orangeburg made and the said Young America Steam Fire Engine Company accepted certain reservations, provisions and conditions, and


WHEREAS, the City of Orangeburg is now desirous of reorganizing the Fire Department and, whereas, the said Young America Steam Fire Engine Company is now the owner and in possession of an American La France Automobile Fire Truck,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg that, in consideration of the services heretofore rendered by the said Young America Steam Fire Engine Company to the said City of Orangeburg, and in consideration of the delivery of an American La France Automobile Fire Truck by the said Company to the said City, which truck is valued as worth approximately Twenty Seven Hundred Seventy Five (\$2775) Dollars, and in consideration of the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars, paid to the said City of Orangeburg by the said Young America Steam Fire Engine Company,

THAT the said City of Orangeburg assume and pay a present indebtedness of Eight Hundred (\$800) Dollars now owed by the said Young America Steam Fire Engine Company on the purchase price of the said truck, and that the said City of Orangeburg execute a quitclaim deed to the real estate referred to above, releasing it from all rights and interest which the said City may have therein by reason of the original reservations, provisions and conditions contained in the deed whereby the said lot was conveyed by the said City to the said Company, so that the said Young America Steam Fire Engine Company shall own the said property in

fee simple, free from all claims that the said City now has or may hereafter have by reason of any provisions, reservations, and conditions contained in the original deed, and

We, the citizens and property owners of Orangeburg, are informed by the officials of the swimming pool, that it is closed because of the lack of financial aid. There is an indebtedness of \$800.00 on the swimming pool property, and unless this money is paid the property will be dismantled and abandoned. We respectfully request the Mayor and Commission to settle this note and take over the property and appoint a commission to operate the same. We feel that this is a necessary institution for recreation and pleasure, especially for the children of our city and community. This Commission will operate the pool as a community service and will charge the children an admission of only TEN cents and will turn over to the City all revenue derived from the operation of the pool above necessary expense

Signed by J.M. Albergotti, P.M. Smoak, W.W. Crum and other citizens

City Council decided that inasmuch as contract entered into between City of Orangeburg and Orangeburg Bathing Co., Sept 13, 1918 had been violated by said bathing Company, they not having paid rent for two years as required by said contract, That City ~~take over~~ take over Swimming Pool, assume payment of note \$800.00 and place management of swimming pool in the hands of three Commissioners. Commission to consist of Messrs Wallace W. Crum,

Mr. Crum to be manager of pool at salary of \$10.00 per week and employ two assistants at \$10.00 per week each. This arrangement to be effective from this date and salaries be paid only while pool is in operation during Summer months and to be paid out of profits of Pool.

Mr. Crum was also authorized to purchase necessary bathing suits to be paid for out of receipts.

Second. That this Council deeply sympathise with his family in their bereavement and tender its condolence and kindest wishes.


