Mr. E. C. Browder personally made complaint to Council that his daughter had been injured at Bathing Pool by having several teeth broken or knocked out by a hose suspended at pool. 


Engineer Hawes reported work on Abattoir progressing satisfactorily, is now placing cover on roof and rendering tank about one half finished.
