continued.

Health officer Dr.W.V.Brabham, advised Council the at a meeting of Board of Health held this morning a resolution was passed requesting Council to have sewer near right of way of Atlantic Coast Line Railroad next to Edisto River be repaired on account of the sanitary condition of same . He asked that these repairs be made as soon as practical to prevent an epidemic of Typhoid Fever and other contagious diseases during coming Spring and Summer.

Council decided to meet on the ground on Monday 14th with City Engineer in order to devise some means to correct this nuisance.

Council also decided to try and get a meeting with County Delegation on same date relative to securing their co-operation in open-up a ditch and other necessary sanitary measures ,by use of road machine owned by county.in section adjacent to Edisti River.

Councilman Sifly stated that Mr.Robt Lide requested that paving around New Court House as agreed upon be laid and a proposal for doing this work was submitted by Mr John Kennerly at 1.65 per square yard. Action on proposal was postponed.

Chief of Police was instructed to prohibit parking of vehicles within 15 feet of corner North Middleton and West Russel Street.

A Resolution authorizing City Treasurer to pay to Mrs Maude Riley Hydrick the sum of One Thousand Dollars for 50 feet lot on Green Street and to charge to City of Orangeburg abutting assessments now due and to be charged against said 50 feet,upon delivery of titles for this lot was passed by following vote:-

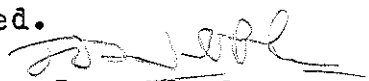

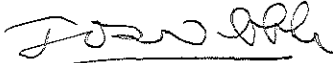

Complying with your request in Re the Bowman Transportation Company's petition to the Railroad Commission, we beg to say that in the opinion of the Board of Directors of the Young Men's Business League the following is the prevailing sentiment of the business concerns in Orangeburg in reference to this matter:

That:

1. A package service between Orangeburg and Swansea, including North and Woodford, is desirable.

a - Because railroads or other public carriers do not now regularly supply this service.

b - Because trains daily serve this territory from Columbia, and Orangeburg Business people are handicapped in doing business in this territory because of lack of such service.

2. Additional transportation service between Columbia and Orangeburg, and Charleston and Orangeburg is not needed as adequate service already exists.

a - Additional service connecting Columbia, Swansea, Woodford and North is not needed.

3. No franchise should be granted to any transportation, truck or drayage service that will give exclusive hauling rights to any one party or company or to hamper in any way the use of the State or county highways by any other bonafide transportation, drayage or hauling party or concern for doing their legitimate business of draying, transporting freight or hauling by contract.

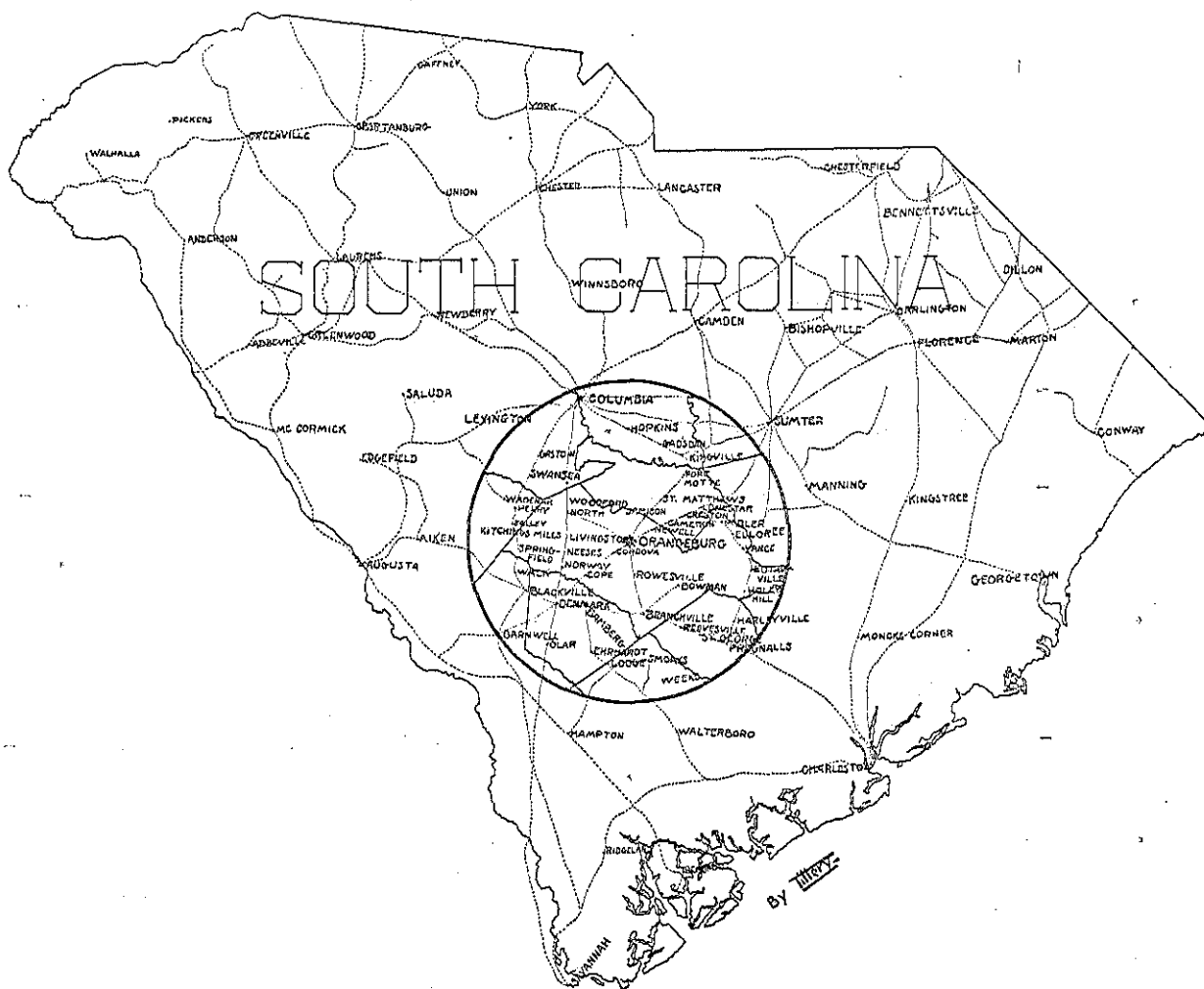
