THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 23rd day of January, A. D. 1951, by and between J. West Summers and C. E. Summers, their heirs and assigns, parties of the first part and City of Orangeburg, its successors and assigns, party of the second part.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that in consideration of the parties of the first part bearing and paying the expenses of laying and installing a sewerage line beginning at a point of intersection of Moss Avenue and Summers Avenue, and running in a northerndirection about eight hundred and fourteen (814) feet as shown on a survey made by Edward Hawes, City Engineer, the party of the second part agrees to reimburse and pay in full the actual cost of the said sewerage line, which includes labor and material, when three houses have been connected with, and served by the said sewerage line, *but in no event earlier than one year from the date hereof.*

IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that the installation of the said sewerage line shall be under the supervision of the City Engineer, which shall be in accordance with the City regulations, and that when the sewerage line has been completed, the City Engineer shall file a statement of the total cost of the work with both parties, which statement shall be the amount that the parties of the first part shall pay, and which shall be the amount that the party of the second part shall reimburse and refund, without interest, to the parties of the first part when the said connections have been made.


