

We have lost money in the operation of the Carolinian Theatre constantly.

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We are not writing to request any permanent change in the terms of the lease. Under ordinary conditions we believe we can operate the Carolinian and make a reasonable profit but, in view of the peculiar adverse conditions of the present year and the prospects for the next twelve months, we felt impelled to present this situation to your attention, feeling that you might be willing to make some temporary reduction in the monthly rental until business conditions generally improved.

Needless to say, we will be very glad to have any representative of your body confer with us, inspect our books and records and confirm for yourself the fact that this Theatre has been a loss.

In connection with the operation of the two local theatres we would like to call attention to the fact that we have repeatedly and constantly reduced the admission prices, which we have done, without any stress upon competition, to emphasize the point which we have made several times with your body that in leasing the Carolinian Theatre we had no desire to run admission prices up to the patronizing public.



The merchants were asked to co-operate with Council in order to handle those who were liable to license and report same to Chief of Police

Relative to those selling fruit and other produce during Christmas week, council advised that only merchants having general merchandise license could use the streets for the sale of their own produce. Others desiring a license will have to secure a place of business and occupy it themselves paying general merchandise license at the same price as paid by regular merchants,

Merchants selling under their license will have the use of the Streets, but will have to give a certificate that sale on street comes within their license for this locality

Council discussed the purchase of mules as some of City mules were in a bad fix, after discussion it was decided that owing to ~~financial~~ present conditions council decided to wait until next year before buying these mules.
