We have lost money in the operation of the Carolinian Theatre constantly.

Dibble be, and he is hereby, instructed to attest said note as an obligation of the City of Orangeburg; the above note represents indebtedness incurred under special statutory authority for the purpose of acquiring and developing Memorial Plaza; the said indebte ness has been represented by two notes of \$27,500 each, one of which was negotiated at the Southern Band and Trust Company and the other at the Edisto National Bank; the sum of \$37,500 now representing the only balance due at this time for this purpose upon both notes; and the said City of Orangeburg pledges the full faith and credit of the said city to the payment of the said note when due.
