Application from Mr Ed Cannon for locating a filling Statio on South Broughton Street ,to be located on property known as Lathrop property oposite Market Street was approved. Station to accord to Fire regulations under charge of Chief of Fire Department

Messrs Cannon and Bennett appeared befor Council relative to opening a Street ,on South Broughton Street,oposite Market Street.

They stated that Street would be 40 feet wide,Council considered this proposition and decided to meet with parties at site of proposed Street on Monday January 15,1934 investigate same.

An Application was submitted by Mr H.Clifton Harley,petitioner, asking council to issue a permit for a modern Funeral Home on his property No 158 East Russel Street. City Attorney was instructed to insert usual advertisement as to any objections by neighborhood as to this location.This matter to come up at fiture meeting of Council.

A communication from Mr W.s.wolfe by direction of The Chamber of Commerce,rdlative to skating on the Streets which is getting to be very dangerous and asked Council to pass police regulations forbidding skating of the Streets and confine same to sidewalks. Council discussed this measure and asked Mr Wolfe to communicate with other Cities and gets their regulations relative to same.

Mrs Bell from Relief Department,asked Council if they would hire an apartment for the storage of clothing &c received from the government for distribution , the mayor stated that he would try and arrange a place for them if possible not to exceed \$10.00 per month.

Mr Wethrington requests that City permit him to remove old trees from the different parks of City for his own use , Council did not think this expedient.

A Resolution that City Clerk is hearby authorized ~~in~~ the Name of the City of Orangeburg to issue pay certificates in the Aggregate of \$50.000 in denominations of \$5.00 and \$1.00 said certificates to be paid on December 1,1934 and shall bear the certificate of The City Clerk and Treasurer ,who shall countersign same in amounts authorized by City Council. Also that the holder of said certificates in units of \$100.00 ,who shall surrender the same to the City Clerk and Treasurer,shall receive in leau thereof

Above request was granted by the following Vote:-



R E S O L U T I O N

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in council assembled and by authority of the same:

That the City Clerk and Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue, in the name of the City of Orangeburg, pay certificates in the aggregate amount of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars; that such pay certificates be in denominations of One (\$1) and Five (\$5) Dollars, certifying that the City of Orangeburg is due to pay the sum of One or Five dollars, respectively, to bearer and that the amount will be paid not later than December 1, 1934; that all such certificates shall bear the countersign of the City Clerk and Treasurer, who shall countersign and issue such certificates in amounts authorized by the City Council from time to time.

That it is provided that any holder of such pay certificates who shall surrender the same to the City Clerk and Treasurer in amounts or units of One Hundred (\$100) Dollars, shall receive in lieu thereof a note of the City of Orangeburg, bearing date the same date that the pay certificates are surrendered, and payable on December 1st, 1934, with interest from date until December 1st, 1934, at six (6%) percent; that the City Clerk and Treasurer shall in each case, before executing the said note, seal the pay certificates surrendered there for in an envelope and mark on the outside the name of the person surrendering the same, the amount of the note issued and the date of the transaction.

That the form of the note to be executed by the City Clerk and Treasurer and given to the holder of the surrendered certificates shall be in substantially the following form:

Mr C.E. Summers submitted a proposition to City Council stating that he owes City on abutting Assessments past due the amount of \$717.86 . He deposited with the City some months ago \$741.96 under an agreement with the City that this amount would be refunded to him as soon as three connections were made on a sewerage connection leading from the intersection of Moss Ave and Summers Avenue to Berry Street. There is now two connections on this said sewerage line

He suggests that if agreement with City that the amount which he has on deposit with city be used to pay Paving assessment past due and let some be in settlement of the other .

This proposition was agreeable with City Council by following Vote. Yea Councilmen Brailsford and Mc Namara.

Agreement attached to and a part of these minutes.

The matter of parking cars within the limits of the city on space for use of fire apparatus when fire occurs . All Cities allow a space of 15 feet on each side of Hydrants, and Orangeburg makes the same requirement. Owing to many fires , during which the Fire Department has been hampered by Automobiles parked near Hydrants The Fire Chief requested that this law be enforced within the City Council decided to enforce this law and instructed Chief to have all hydrant spaces painted and told Chief of Police to enforce ordinance.

Mr J.L. Weeks submitted a petition very largely signed asking for a policeman to be stationed in the vicinity of Dukes Avenue and Broughton Streets during night time. Council advised him that they were working on this problem at this time.

Mr C.C. Whissenhunt , applicant for Finger print Expert , submitted several recommendations from Mayors and Chief's of Police as to, his ability in this line. City Clerk was instructed to file same away.

I am indebted to the City of Orangeburg in the amount of Seven Hundred Seventeen and 86/100 (\$717.86) Dollars for paving assessments past due.



Gentlemen:

Several months ago at a meeting of your body, your Mayor, Mr. Jennings, submitted a proposition to the Orangeburg County Emergency Relief Administration which, if my memory serves me correctly, was of this nature. The City of Orangeburg would turn over to us the abattoir provided we would operate same for the public and that the use of any lands upon which crops were planted would be used subject to satisfactory negotiations with persons who had the land leased for planting for the current year. My impression was that we would have access to the entire City property adjacent to the abattoir provided arrangements could be made with Mr. Frank Cartmill who had planted crops thereon this year. We were unable to reach an agreement with Mr. Cartmill, but we have to this date, and will continue to do so, protected his crops, relying on the assumption that we could use the land when the crops were moved.

Several weeks ago I was informed by Mr. McNamara, who has charge of this division of the City property, that bids would be made on the rental of the City property for the coming year. In view of the proposition which was offered us by the Council, this was naturally quite a surprise to us. We did not expect to have to pay any rent on this property, but I felt that as the Council thought we should pay them rent, that we would make what seemed to me a fair bid. A sealed bid was submitted to Mr. McNamara for \$105.00. I have been told by Mr. McNamara that we lost the bid.

As has been said, our reliance on the assumption that we were to have access of the property caused us to make considerable and expensive repairs thereon. In addition to a great improvement to the property which has already been made, we have made plans to put the land in excellent farming condition for truck crops which we hoped to plant for distribution to our relief clients. It appears now that there is a possibility of the erection of additional killing apparatus to the abattoir and possibly a cannery. This can not be affected as the situation now stands.

Our Columbia office has not been informed that we will not have these lands available next year as I was in hopes that some adjustment could be made before this information was given to them, because they, as we have, have felt certain that we would have the entire property for the coming year.

I am attaching hereto several copies of an agreement which it will be necessary for the City Council of Orangeburg to execute at the request of the Bureau of Public Roads, which Bureau has supervision over the funds which are to be expended for the improvement of west Russell Street between Broughton Street and the Edisto River in the City of Orangeburg.

Rather than a straight 50' right-of-way, as mentioned in this agreement, the right-of-way should be described as the width between the outside edges of the existing concrete sidewalk. You are also requested to insert the paragraph regarding the building restriction on future buildings along this street. You will also mention any traffic regulations.

You will note that this agreement states that the City shall re-arrange all light poles, fire hydrants, man holes, etc., at no cost to the Department. In this connection I would like to call your attention to the fact that the plans show three man holes to be re-arranged, this expense having been included in the proposal form.

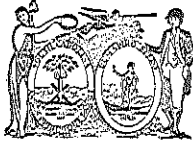

Gentlemen:

The Hamilton Veneer Company, of this City, which has been unable to operate for the past two years, is contemplating certain re-adjustments and possibly a reorganization and hopes to be able to begin regular operation in the near future.


In line with this purpose, the Hamilton Veneer Co. proposes to convey to the City of Orangeburg something more than ten (10) acres of its land in return for approximately one-half (1/2) acre of land now owned by the City of Orangeburg and acceptance of the stipulations hereinafter added. The land affected is more fully shown on a plat made by Edward Hawes, City Engineer, dated October 23rd, 1934.

In settlement therefor, the Hamilton Veneer Company would accept from the City of Orangeburg gradual payment to be made yearly for five (5) years through the annual credit of an amount equal to the City taxes, including license tax, assessed against the said Company; in addition, the Hamilton Veneer Company is to be relieved of any and all taxes now outstanding, including those of 1934; so that the effect of the sale of the land referred to is that the Hamilton Veneer Company will not be subject to real or personal taxes on its plant and adjoining property, or license tax, until and after January 1st, 1940.

In addition, in connection with the conveying to the City the right-of-way for West Glover Street, extension, the Hamilton Veneer Company is not to be liable for any improvement assessments on such Street for a period of ten (10) years; it is further understood that the Hamilton Veneer Company is to have the right to remove any or all timber on this right-of-way for a period of three months after being given notice by the City of an intention to improve the said right-of-way; and it is understood and agreed that the City, in conveying to Hamilton Veneer Co. the small tract of land referred to in this agreement, reserved all drainage rights heretofore granted it by Hamilton Veneer Company.

It is part of the consideration between Hamilton Veneer Co. to the City that all parts of the joint agreement shall apply to the successors and assigns of both parties. Also this proposal is made with the understanding that if the Hamilton Veneer Co.'s plant is abandoned, then, in that event, the above agreement is to be void and of none effect, except that the conveyances of real estate shall be irrevocable. The conveyance of the real estate, one to the other, shall be in part performance and the proposal when accepted by the City Council shall be considered as a binding contract between the parties.


