WHEREAS, the City Council on October 19, 1936 authorized by ordinance the issuance of Twenty-Seven Thousand (\$27,000) Dollars hospital revenue bonds and;

WHEREAS, it was discovered thereafter by the officials of the P.W.A. that they had made a mistake in the maturities of the said bonds which had been printed for the City of Orangeburg and;

WHEREAS, on December 23, 1936 the City Council by ordinance authorized the issuance of Twenty-Seven Thousand (\$27,000) Dollars hospital revenue bonds in lieu of and to take the place of the bonds printed under the authorization of the ordinance passed October 19, 1936.

Now, it is hereby declared by the undersigned that on the fifth (5th) day of January 1937, in the presence of each of us, the said Twenty-Seven Thousand (\$27,000) Dollars hospital revenue bonds, authorized under the ordinance passed October 19, 1936, were burned in the furnace in the basement of the City Hall, at Orangeburg, S. C. and that each one of the subscribers hereto saw the said bonds counted and placed in the furnace and utterly destroyed.

The City Council of the City of Orangeburg, Orangeburg County, South Carolina, met in special session at the City Hall on January 22, 1937. There were present the following members:

Hon. R. H. Jennings, Mayor; Councilmen James M. Brailsford and John McNamara. Absent: None.

The City Council met for the purpose of receiving bids for the sale of \$44,000.00 Water Works Revenue bonds and \$56,000.00 Electric Light Plant Revenue bonds.

Two bids were received by the City Council, to wit:

(1). A joint bid by The First National Bank, the Bank of Copeland and the Southern National Bank, all of Orangeburg, South Carolina, by M. H. Whetsell, agent, offering \$100,600.00.

(2). A bid by McAllister, Smith & Pate, Inc., offering \$100,270.00.

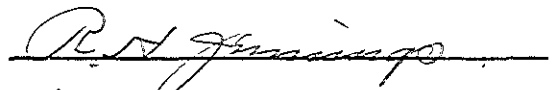

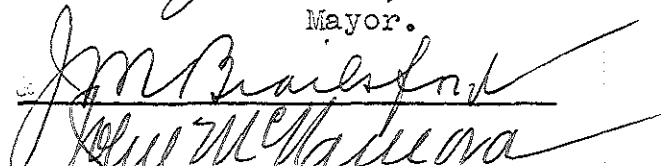

Minutes of regular meeting held January 8 and special meeting held January 11, read and approved.

Mr. R. A. Bowman appeared before Council regarding certain conditions existing in the City that he felt should be remedied such as the railroad crossing on North Boulevard, the paving being in a rough condition and City Clerk was instructed to write Mr. Cooper regarding this crossing.

Mr. Bowman also recommended that all vehicles be allowed to make right turns on red lights and that public begging on the streets be done away with.

Council advised Mr. Bowman that most of the cities were doing away with the right turn on red lights and also that begging on the streets was a violation of the city ordinance and referred this matter to the Chief of Police.

Mr. R. T. Poole, president of the Spintrate Products Company of Columbia requested City Council to lease to him the cannery building at the City Abattoir in order that he might open his business of manufacturing spintrate in the City of Orangeburg. After discussion of same, Council took this matter under advisement, to render a decision at a later date.

Mr. J. W. Sheriff requested the City Council to pipe the ditches on his property, said ditches draining the rain water off the lowlands of the cities streets in this vicinity. Council agreed to meet with Mr. Sheriff on the property along with the City Engineer to see what could be done regarding this matter.


A delegation of property owners in the northern part of the city represented by Messrs. J. W. and C. E. Summers appeared before Council again to determine what action had been taken by the City regarding the paving of certain streets of which they had petitioned Council some time ago to do. Council agreed to investigate this matter at once and if possible, proceed with the work at the earliest possible date, by the following vote,
Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

Mr. D. K. Robinson requested permission to place iron stubs on the city's grass plot in front of the home of Mrs. Julia Thomas on East Amelia Street to protect her shrubbery. It was explained to Mr. Robinson that in the event someone should be injured by these iron stubs they would sue the City and this request was therefore denied.

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL DAIRIES OR DEALERS IN MILK TO HAVE THEIR NAME MARKED ON THE MILK BOTTLES was read by title and passed to second reading by the following vote, Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

The Mayor and City Clerk were authorized to sign a note to the Bank of Cape borrowing \$15,000.00 at 5% discount, by the following vote,
Yea, the Mayor, Councilmen Brailsford and McNamara.

TRAFFIC REGULATION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS The municipality of Orangeburg S. C.

does hereby and herewith officially request and authorize the South Carolina State Highway Department to improve a section of South Railroad Avenue Street from Mill Street to Bayne street along U. S. or State Route No. 21² in accordance with the plans, specifications, and regulations of the South Carolina State Highway Department and/or the Bureau of Public Roads, U. S. Department of Agriculture, and

WHEREAS, It is necessary in order to secure the benefit of the proposed improvement for the municipality to assume certain definite obligations in connection with the regulation of traffic on and the clearing and future protection of the right-of-way established for the proposed improvement,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved that all laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, or traffic signals regulating the speed limits, traffic movements, or parking of vehicles on this section of highway will be established by the municipality in cooperation with the State Highway Department and the traffic on this section of the highway will not be penalized or made secondary to the traffic of abutting or cross streets, and no unreasonable speed limits will be established for the traffic on this street.

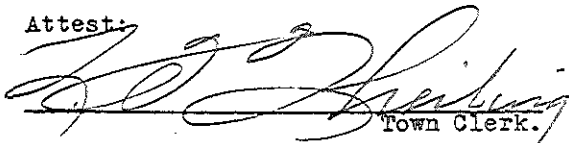
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the municipality will legally protect the right-of-way as shown by the plans prepared by the State Highway Department and as established for this street from future encroachment along any or all parts of the improvement covered by this agreement, and that all municipal water and sewer pipes, manholes, or fire hydrants and all power, light, telegraph, or telephone poles will be moved or rearranged, and all necessary rights-of-way for drainage ditches or pipes will be secured to conform to the plans for the proposed improvement and that all of the above will be done without any expense to the State Highway Department and/or the Bureau of Public Roads.

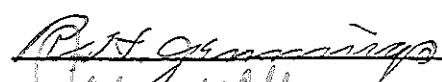

2. PAYMENTS.-- Payments to the Architect on account of
his fee shall be made as follows:

Upon completion of specifications and general work-
ing drawings (exclusive of details), 60% of the rate of com-
mission arising from this Agreement, computed upon the lowest
bona fide bid.

Agreement #2.

From time to time during the execution of work and in proportion to the amount of service rendered by the Architect, payments shall be made until the aggregate of all payments made on account of the fee under this Article shall be a sum equal to the rate or rates of commission arising from this agreement, computed upon the final cost of the work.

No deductions shall be made from the Architect's fee on account of penalty, liquidated damages, or other sums withheld from payments to contractors.

3. SUPERVISION OF THE WORK.-- The Architect will endeavor to guard the Owner against defects and deficiencies in the work of contractors, but he does not guarantee the performance of their contracts. The supervision of an Architect is to be distinguished from the continuous personal superintendence to be obtained by the employment of a clerk-of-the-works.

4. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS.-- Drawings and specifications as instruments of service are the property of the Architect, whether the work for which they are made be executed or not.

5. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNMENTS.-- The Owner and the Architect, each binds himself, his partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns to the other party to this agreement, and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns of such other party in respect of all covenants of this agreement.


Except as above, neither the Owner nor the Architect shall assign, sublet or transfer his interest in this agreement without the written consent of the other.

6. ARBITRATION.-- All questions in dispute under this agreement shall be submitted to arbitration at the choice of either party.


The Owner and the Architect hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants contained herein.

The communication of Mr. Strange dated November 15, 1937 and the letter of the City Council dated November 17, 1937, constituted the agreement entered into and are hereby made a part of these minutes.

Council of the City of Orangeburg.

Gentlemen:

Item 1. Power. Since the City of Orangeburg operates its own Electric Power Plant, I bother you gentlemen with my power needs. At the last meeting of your body before whom I appeared this question of ample 220 voltage for all size and type motors, both for present and future installations, was discussed. The outcome of that appearance was that I would write the Georgia Power Co. engineers at Columbus for information as to why they started the packing plant there on 220 volts, then put the first 60 H. P. motor we bought on 2200 volts and then before we could install a 125 H. P. synchronous motor on the 2200 they voluntarily erected a small sub-station and put everything back on 220. I have received a reply to that letter. The recipient of my letter advises as follows:

"This morning I called at the Georgia Power Company's offices and had a talk with Mr. R. K. Picker, the gentleman who had charge of changing the voltage at The Provision Company here from 220 to 2300 and thence back to 220.

"He explained this situation by saying that the changes were made necessary in order to take care of the increase in the load required by The Provision Company as it expanded its operations. The return from 2300 back to 220 voltage was due to the necessity for standardizing the equipment at this company so that it could get the advantage of the lowest possible rate. It seems that at one time there were two substations furnishing this company with electricity and that later they were combined into one larger substation.

"Mr. Picker suggests that Mr. Strange confer with the proper authority representing the Orangeburg utility and that any changes which took place at The Provision Company could be eliminated entirely by installing the proper units at the start so that they might be able to take care of the future added needs of the packing plant as it expanded from time to time."

Now, gentlemen, I must have a decision now "yes" or "no." Will you furnish proper size transformers for 220 volts and enough of them to take care of the packing plant's immediate requirements and future requirements where we will be assured of ample 220 voltage.

Item 2. Inspection. At my last appearance before you I mentioned the possibility of placing the plant under U. S. Government inspection. When in Washington last Thursday I discussed this at length with Bureau of Animal officials. There would have to be drastic changes made that are prohibitive at this time. It would necessitate the insulation of 4050 sq. ft. of building on first and second floors to overcome lack of natural light. Also the removal of one entire reinforced concrete floor due to lack of ceiling height and the abandonment of a portion of the basement for the purposes for which it was intended. Also the elimination from the building of present dressing rooms (There are four of these). It will be some time before we can hope to attain enough volume to force us across state lines. Since inspection is primarily for the public's benefit it is also at public expense. I am asking you gentlemen to assure me that a full-time veterinarian will be placed at the packing plant and that the plant will be designated as the Public Abattoir.

Item 3. Abattoir Equipment. Also discussed at last meeting. Since there is some equipment that came out of the packing plant now at the Abattoir and some equipment that has been purchased to round out this equipment, we in return for providing abattoir

facilities for the public at no expense to the City for the operation of same, be loaned this equipment, or better sell it to us at a very nominal sum, because with the abattoir shut down this equipment would soon deteriorate to junk values or be stolen.

Item 4. Sewers. This item was brought up also and ample sewage promised. If packing plant of present size was operating it would require 12" sewer. If in the future additions to plant of any consequence were made then a 15" sewer would be necessary. This is a very important item.

Item 5. Road to Plant. It was my understanding there will be a good road developed to the highway eliminating dangerous R. R. crossings.

In review, I don't think I have asked for much. Regarding Power, I am a prospective customer requiring considerable power for which of course we will pay. In regards inspector, this will cost you nothing, as you will eliminate any deficit at abattoir. Since plant is in County, they possibly could bear portion of inspector's salary. In regards abattoir equipment, this would release building for some other purpose and salvage equipment. As to sewers, this may be out of pocket expense but could easily prove beneficial to that section in the near future. Road- this is sorely needed for the public to get to the plant with raw material, as well as for the plant's trucks to leave with finished product.

In conclusion I might leave this thought: There has been close to half million dollars invested at one time or another by your people and still no packing plant. What I am asking you to do today is only a drop in the bucket. In figuring on the above, gentlemen, please consider that I am buying some equipment much larger than I will need for some time, so I won't have to replace in a year or so. I need power now.

I wish you gentlemen would incorporate your final decisions on these matters in your minutes and give me a copy for my files. I must make my decision immediately. My total investment to date is only about 1% of that contemplated, and unless these matters are settled in a thorough and businesslike manner at this meeting I must withdraw.

Dear Mr. Strange:

The City Council of the City of Orangenburg, having received your communication, dated November 15, 1937, and having given the matters discussed in your letter serious consideration, makes the following reply to the items listed in your communication:

Item 1. The City of Orangenburg will provide the Packing Plant with complete electric service on 220-volts, or, if desired, on 2300-volts, or a combination service, including 220 volts and 2300 volts. It will be necessary for you to notify the Water and Light Plant of the type service you desire in order that proper transformers and equipment may be ordered to apply, without delay, the service that you desire. This notification to the Water and Light Plant should be in writing.

Item 2. The City of Orangenburg will provide a licensed veterinarian at the Packing Plant for a period not to exceed three years. The Packing Plant will be designated as the public abattoir, subject to the condition that it performs the service to the public now being rendered at the abattoir and at the rates now charged at the said abattoir.

Item 3. The City will lend the Packing Plant the equipment now used at the abattoir, provided the Packing Plant provides proper abattoir facilities for the public at no expense to the City and at rates to the public as provided in Item 2; it is further provided that if the Packing Plant fails to provide the abattoir facilities herein mentioned, it will return the said equipment to the City of Orangenburg.

Item 4. The City will repair and restore the present twelve-inch sewer line from the Packing Plant to the Edisto River, with the proviso that the City of Orangenburg shall have the right to continue its present use of the said sewer line from Broughton Street to the said River.

Item 5. The roads and highways to the Packing Plant being entirely outside of the City limits, this becomes a matter to be handled with the proper County officials.

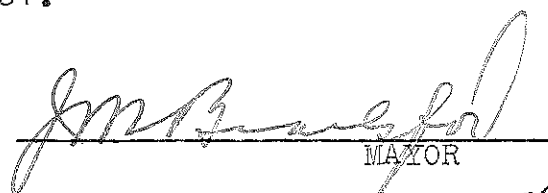

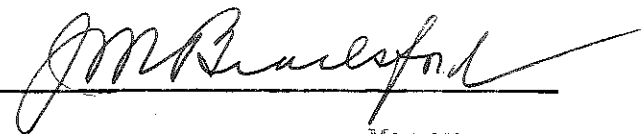

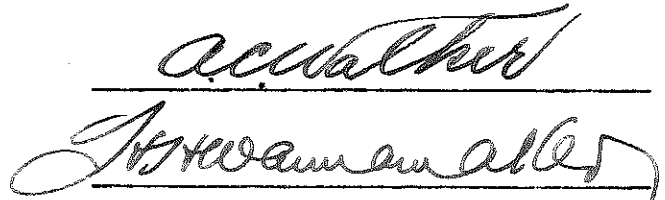
