Mr. L. A. Hutson appeared before Council in behalf of Frank McGill requesting a license for phrenologists. After discussion, Council advised Mr. Hutson that the city license would be issued provided Mr. McGill met the requirements of the Ordinance.

Rev. J. M. Lane requested Council to have the trees removed in front of the proposed new church building on Fairey street, and Council authorized the city engineer to remove these trees by the following vote.

WHEREAS, the said Edisto Homes, Inc. is about to let a contract for the paving of the said Evergreen Street and the circular driveway,

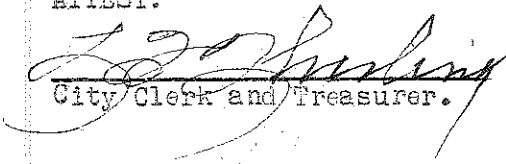
NOW, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Orangeburg, in council assembled and by authority of the same, that the said Evergreen Street and the circular driveway is hereby accepted as a street of the City of Orangeburg and the City of Orangeburg likewise accepts the donation of the park area which measures one hundred (100) feet in diameter, all of which is shown on the plat hereinabove referred to; and


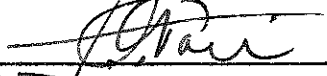

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Orangeburg that if the said Edisto Homes, Inc., proceeds to pave the said street and circular driveway, the City of Orangeburg will, whenever it undertakes a general paving program in the City of Orangeburg, reimburse the said Edisto Homes, Inc., for that portion of the cost of the said paving which will represent the part of the cost which the City would pay in connection with a general paving program; provided, that in fixing the amount of the City's share, the City of Orangeburg is to have the option of basing its share upon the cost of the said paving to the said Edisto Homes, Inc., or the cost of similar paving to the said City in connection with a general program, whichever is lowest, and that the said reimbursement shall be without any interest payment whatever, that the time of repayment to the said Edisto Homes shall be determined by the City Council whenever in its judgment it deems the said repayment proper and in line with the policy of the City towards other paving projects, and that the paving of

the said street and circular driveway shall conform to the regulations and instructions of the City Engineer.

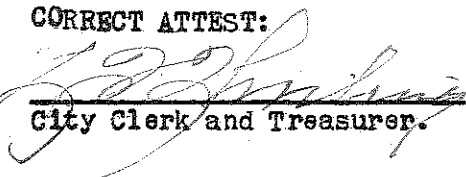

REGULATIONS

I SCHEDULE

Teams desiring to rent the park will make application to the Secretary, Thomas R. Wolfe, Phone No. 155. The schedule of the Palmetto League will take precedence over other applications. The schedule of the American Legion Team shall have next priority. In order to reserve a date, however, a \$5.00 deposit must be posted, which will be refunded if the park is used, forfeited if not used. This deposit must be posted with the City Treasurer at least five days prior to the date reserved.

2 RENTAL FEES

LIGHTS

A flat charge of \$25.00 will be made for all games involving the use of the lighting system.

FIELD

A flat charge of \$25.00 will be made for the use of the field and park. Games scheduled by the Palmetto League as play-offs for the championship of the league, and games outside the regular league schedule involving all-star games, etc., will be charged Five (.05 cts) Cents per admission ticket on all tickets above 500 sold for such a game.

RAINED OUT GAMES

A game which is not completed due to the weather may be played at a later date at the following reduced prices:

Lights ----- \$12.50  
Field ----- \$12.50

PRACTICE

No charge will be made for daytime practice. The charge for the use of lights during night practice will be the actual costs of the current as indicated by the meter reading.

COLLECTIONS

All rental fees will be paid in advance to L. F. Theiling, City Treasurer.

3 UPKEEP

FIELD AND PARK

Maintenance of the field and Park will be the responsibility of the City Park Superintendent, Andrew Dibble.

LIGHTS

It will be the duty of the Superintendent of the Water and Light Plant, Mr. John Pearson, to operate and maintain the lighting system.

4 POLICE AND PARKING

Police protection in and at the park will be under the supervision of Chief T. E. Salley. Chief Salley will be responsible for the parking of cars at the park and vicinity.

5 ADVERTISING SPACE

Space on the inside of the fence surrounding the park will be rented on a yearly basis with option of renewal to those desiring to advertise, at a rate of \$3.00 per running foot. Spaces of less than 10 feet will not be rented. Applications for advertising space will be made to Jerry M. Hughes, Jr., Phone No. 585J. Allocation of spaces will be on a first-come first-served basis.

6 CONCESSION RIGHTS

Concession rights will be sold to the highest bidder. Application will be in the form of sealed bids. Bids will be submitted to the City Treasurer, L. F. Theiling, not later than noon, March 26th, 1948. Bids will be opened at 1 o'clock P. M., March 26th, 1948. It shall be written into the contract with the concessionaire that the sale of alcoholic beverages in or at the park will not be permitted.

In deference to the fact that the team representing Orangeburg in the Palmetto League will play the largest number of games at Mirmow Field, and is a community project, One-Half of the proceeds of the concession rights will be donated to the team.

7 GAMES

TICKETS, TICKET SELLERS, TICKET TAKERS

It will be the responsibility of the team or teams renting the park to provide for tickets, cashiers, etc., and any other incidentals connected with the sale of tickets.

SEATING

The seating of patrons will be the responsibility of the competing teams, working with the Police Department, and will be according to plans worked out with the Baseball Commission.

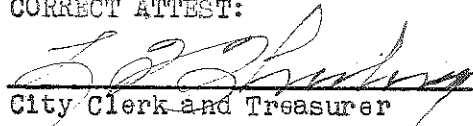

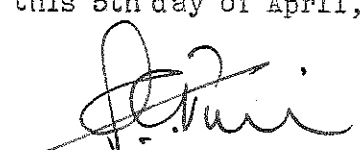
WHEREAS, the year 1948 marks the seventy-first anniversary of the initiation of public nursing in the United States,
