ACREFMENT

This agreement entered into this 373 day of JECENTYPT, 1951 between THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG, S. C., AND The South Carolina State Highway Department.

WHEREAS The South Carolina State Highway Department in conjunction with the Bureau of Public Roads and the City of Orangeburg, S. C., proposes to relocate, construct, or improve, under a Federal Aid Urban Improvement program, certain sections of U. S. Route 301 through the City, as it is considered impracticable to widen and improve the streets along the present routing of U. S. Route 301 due to the excessive right of way costs and moving of buildingsfrom the widened right of way; the new location to follow a route along a new location to be determined.

proportionate one fourth (1/4) share of all costs for rights of way on all properties lying within the city limits, including cost of lands, special damages, tenant and/or lessee rights, legal and appraisal fees, if any, and other incidental expenses incurred in connection with acquiring said rights of way; but exclusive of the cost of removing those obstructions from the right of way shown on the plans for this docket to be covered as items in the contract,

and gas lines, telephone, telegraph and electric power poles, and/or all other public utilities and appartenances thereto that may interfere with the construction of this project, and to secure rights of way for all drainage ditches and pipe lines necessary to conform to the plans for the proposed improvement.

AND WHEREAS, all rights of way cannot be acquired by negotiation, and condemnation may be necessary in securing the necessary rights of way for the proposed work.

NOW, THENTFORE, BU IT RESOLVED that the City of Orangeburg, S. C., acting through its mayor and councilmen, accepts the terms of this agreement and hereby requests the South Carolina State Highway Department to condemn, in the name of the State Highway Department and The City of Orangeburg, S. C., all necessary rights of way within the corporate limits of said City that cannot be acquired by negotiation for the construction of this improvement, and agree to assume one fourth (1/4) the cost of all rights of way including the awards of Condemnation Board and appeals therefrom and other costs incident to right of way acquisition.

AND RE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this agreement shall be spread upon and become a part of the minutes of the council of the City of Orangeburg, S. C.
