The City Administrator presented to Council a detailed summary of the bids for Motor Fuel, Motor Lubricating Oils and Tires for City requirements for 1960. On motion by Councilman Limehouse, Seconded by Councilman Blackmon, the Pure Oil Company was awarded Motor Fuel and Oil and The Clark Tire Company was awarded Tires by the unanimous vote of the Council. All awards were to the low bidder.

The City Administrator read a letter addressed to Councilman Nell Blackmon, from representatives of the new Youth Center on Peasley street, requesting certain additional supplies etc. for the Center. The Council asked Mr. Brown, the City Administrator to answer this letter denying such requests.

The Manager of the Department of Public Utilities discussed with Council and the school board of district No. 5, the water facilities for the new school site between the Columbia Road and the St. Matthews Road. Council agreed to install a six inch line to the new site and the school board agreed to finance the cost of same and Council agreed to refund the cost of any portion when and if it was ever taken into the city. The general terms of the agreement between Council and the school board are as contained in the letter of December 18, 1959, from the Department of Public Utilities to Mr. Harris A. Marshall. The following is a resume of the results of the conference this date between you, Mr. L. R. Wells and the writer concerning the extension of a six inch water line to the site of your proposed school north of Orangeburg between the Columbia Road and the St. Matthews Road:

- 1. The Trustees to bear the total installation cost from the City Limits except that all engineering and supervision will be furnished by the Department.
 All pipe to be installed in accordance with the specifications of the Department.
- 2. The Department will reimburse the Trustees for any portion or all of the pipe installed at such time it is incorporated in the City of Orangeburg; the amount of reimbursement will be the installation cost borne by the Trustees less \$3500.00, the estimated cost of drilling a well and installing a pump.
- 3. The Trustees shall have the right to sell water connections on the above said line, provided, however, that all such connections meet the approval of the Department, and that all work involved in making any and all connections to the line will be done by the Department and upon written request from the Trustees; and the Department will charge their regular tap fee therefor. All users, thereof, including the Trustees,

shall pay the same water rate as is applicable to other users residing outside the City of Orangeburg.

4. The Department agrees to operate and maintain the above mentioned line and shall have complete control over its operation except as stated above.

1. A group of representatives of the Orangeburg City School Board and the Board of Assessors of District No. 5, Orangeburg County, along with No. Herris Mershall, City School Superintendent, appeared to discuss with Council a suggestion exampling from the Board of Assessors that it employ scheme to study tex assessments and returns in District 5, with a view of equalizing such assessments, and that the City contribute to the costs of such study.

Appearing for the Board of Assessors: - Mr. Watt E. Smith, Chairman, Mr. Charles W. Culler, Jr., Mr. D. D. Salley II, Mr. Roger Council, Mr. Faul Cantwelland Mr. Bert Gie'; appearing for the School Board: - Mr. Larry R. Walls, Chairman, Mr. Talley B. Smith, Vice Chairman, Mr. Edgar Culler and Dr. J. H. Atwill, Jr.

Statements of the needs of equalization were made by Hesses. Hett Smith, Roger Council, D. D. Salley and others. There ensured a general discussion of the problem - including a statement by Mayor Pair of the City's need for additional revenue, also statements by Councilman Shuler and Wannemaker opposing an increase in millage.

Next a formula was suggested by the City Administrator for the City's participation - such formula based on the percentage of the City's property text to the total City, County and School property text levied for the District - which according to 1958 assessments would cause the City to pay 21.6% of the costs of the survey.

On motion by Councilman Smaler, seconded by Councilman Linehouse, the City Council unanimously agreed to participate in the plan to the extent of its share of the costs, according to the formula, with the provision that the City's share not exceed \S 2,000.00 annually.

BE IT RESOLVED By the Mayor and City Council of the City of Orangeburg of South Carolina, as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of legalizing the receipt of, and use and custodianship of, Civil Defense property coming under the provisions of the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization Property Programs there is hereby created the position of Property Officer. This position will be maintained by a succession of appointees for so long time as may be necessary to comply with the provisions of the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization rules and regulations relative to its Property Programs.

SECTION 2. The Property Officer shall be responsible for carrying out all Federal Civil Defense requirements relating to legal use of, storage, maintenance, resale, and reports on such property. He shall be prepared for inspections of such property by qualified Federal or State representatives, and shall assist such inspectors upon request.

SECTION 3. Funds for carrying out the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 (above) will be provided on a need to have basis by this governing body.

SECTION 4. The intent of, and reason for, the provisions in Sections 1, 2, and 3 (above) is to provide a means for the assumption by this political subdivision of South Carolina of the responsibilities, costs, and obligations which form a part of Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization Property Programs executed by the State of South Carolina Civil Defense Agency for the delivery of, and use by, this political subdivision, of property under the provisions of such program.

SECTION 5. Mr. A. T. Brown is hereby appointed Property Officer and authorized to utilize the services of personnel under his direction to carry out the provisions herein above enumerated.

SECTION 6. All Resolutions or parts of Resolutions inconsistent with the foregoing are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 7. A copy of this Resolution with original signature is to be sent to and filed with the State of South Carolina Civil Defense Agency at Columbia.

STATEMENT RELATING TO CLOSING A SECTION OF LAUREL STREET.

The Board of Trustees of Orangeburg Regional Hospital, thru its Executive Committee, requests the cooperation of the Orangeburg City Council in the matter of closing the 250 ft. section of Laurel Street which separates the hospital properties situated on the North and South sides of Laurel Street.

No objection to this action by affected property owners has been brought to our attention. Dr. J. C. Shecut and Dr. Gramling, property owners in the same block, have specifically expressed themselves as being agreeable to this closure. There are no other property owners affected whose property does not also border on another street.

The area involved is bady needed for the expansion of the hospital. The specific plans and details are incomplete, enough work has been done along this line to establish the necessity for the use of this area. Several plans have been studied which would not involve this area; without exception they have been found to be impractical either from an operational or financial standpoint. The concassion of our study is that the needs of the hospital, which means the Medical welfare of the people in the City of Grangeburg and in Grangeburg County, can best be met at this time by the erection of a wing on the South side of the present plant which would cover a protion of Laurel Street which we request closed.

Legal obstacles prevented clear title to the hospital property on the South side of Laurel Street until a few days before the 1960 session of the General Assembly adjourned. To prevent any further delay, at our request the Grangeburg County Delegation caused to be passed legislation supporting the request herein made before the adjournment of the General Assembly.

Your cooperation in this matter is earnestly solicited.

Mayor Fair stated first order of business to consider a solution to the problem of the First Baptist Church's appeal to Council to ammend the Zoning Ordinance to permit the construction of an educational building encreaching upon the 10 foot set back required by the Ordinance. After a general discussion Council agreed that it would be emenable to an emendment, provided the Building Committee of the Church would agree to the solution, such amendment being substantially as follows: - add to Section 8, Par. C-

This Canteen is to be operated under the supervision of the Recreation Division—which will provide a supervising hostess.

- Councilman Blackmon and the City Administrator reported to Council on several conferences held with representatives of the Advisory Committee of the Zimmerman Carbeen on Pessley Street. In summary the report re-commended that the proposals submitted by Mrs. Zimmerman be denied and that this activity be placed under the Recreation Director and his assistant to be administered in a like manner to the Middleton Street Canbean. Council unanimously authorized such action to become effective at the discreation of Councilman Blackmon and the City Administrator tho desired to delay its effectuation a few days to give certain parties an opportunity to persuade Mrs.Zimmerman to withdraw her proposals -(Copy of proposal attached below)
- 6. Council unanimously authorized the City Administrator to immediately call for bids on 3 new cars for the Police Division as provided in the budget for the coming year.
- To further business the neeting edjourned.

On J. H. Cressette, Chaluman of the Building Committee of the First Baptist Church, Harris Marshall and John Inschinet, Architect, met with Council at 6:40 P.M. to discuss the proposed Sunday School building for which a building permit had been denied - with denial sustained by the Zoning Board of Adjustment. Council had sutherized Mayor Fair to contact the Baptist group and get their reaction to a proposal for amending the City's Zoning Ordinance to permit the building to be constructed with a minimum six-foot side yard on Middleton Street side. Br. Gressette, Mr. Inabinet and Mr. Marshall expounded their reasons for wanting to build within 31 - 9% of the property line. A general discussion of the problems and attitudes was held. The Committee urged Council to grant relief denied by the Board of Adjustment but showed no inclination to accept any compromise on the distance the proposed building is to be set back from the street line. The six-foot compromise suggested by Council was unacceptable to the Committee.

Souncil promised further consideration and a definite determination by September 21st.

- 2. The Council them adjourned the Special Meeting to immediately reconvens in regular session in Council Chambers.
- 3. After the regular session Council again took up consideration of the Baptist Countities's request. After review and discussion it was moved by Councilman Limehouse, seconded by Councilman Blackmon, to fix the Council's position as being agreeable to a five-foot set back on Middleton Street. Councilman Wannamaker offered an amendment to the motion, accepted by Councilman Limehouse, proposing an amendment to the City's Zoning Ordinance to apply throughout the "C-1" District as follows:

Add to Section 6, Par. O:

"Except on corner lots the minimum side yard required may be reduced to not less than 5 feet, manage ecommonded by the Planning Countsion feet that City of Granceburg and its Environs and approved by City Countsion."

- 4. The amended motion was put and carried with Mayor Fair, Souncilmen Limehouse, Blackmon, Shuler, and Wannamaker voting for none opposed. Mayor Fair stated that he personally opposed the idea but that in the spirit of compromise he would go this far, but no farther.
- 5. Council Chrested the City Administrator to advertise the statutory public hearing on the proposed amendment for the regular Council session at 7:00 P.M., October 18, 1960.
- 6. No further business the meeting adjourned.

Injury to person allegedly came by the negligance of the City of Orangeburg or the State Highway Department.

Date of Report: 10-3-60
Date of Injury: 7:30 FM, 9-17-60
Injured Person: Mrs. Daisy Rigos, Age 56, Race White Address: 319 Cornelson, SE, Orangeburg, S. C.

West side of Cummers, NE (400 Block) approximately Place of Injury:

200 feet south of the intersection of Summers and Ellis. SCHD Road No. 38-131 in the City of Orangeburg

The cause of injury was as follows:

Sections of concrete sidewalk at different elevation due to tree roots elevating some sections of the comprete sidewalk. Also the driveway at or where the claimant fell is broken and uneven. There is a street light on the N.W. Corner approximately 250 feet from where the claimant fell. I inspected this site at 7:30 PM 9-19-60 and found that in my opinion a normal person could walk on the concrete sidewalk without difficulty.

Description of injury is given below:

Injury to right knee, right side of face bruised, sore muscles on right side near the ribs and was unable to walk until Sunday A.M.

The claimant stated that she and her sister, Miss Viola Bushton, had been to visit her husband at the hospital and was walking home when she fell; that Mr. Joe Saunders, 485 Summers, N.E., in front of whose home the accident occurred, carried her home; that she could not get a doctor to come to see her until the next A.M. (9-18-60). Dr. H. M. Earyle examined her and instructed her to take some medicine that he gave her and stay in bed until she felt better.

During my conversation with Mrs. Riggs she stated that she was accustomed to having blackout spells and prior to this accident she had blacked out and broken both arms at different times. Also, that she had fallen twice while being employed at the Orange Cotton Mill and had been released by them, presumably because of her falling.

I contacted Mr. Joe Saunders at 485 Summers, N.B., and he stated that the two ladies valked to his home and asked that he carry them home which he did. He did not see Mrs. Riggs fall neither did he know the exact spot where she fell and that in his opinion any mormal person could walk the sidewalk without falling.

I also contacted Mr. Margle on 9-29-60 and he stated that he had visited Mrs. Riggs on 9-18-60 and had not heard from her since.

I recommend that the City of Orangeburg pay Dr. Earsle for his visit and that Mrs. Rigas be paid \$25.00 for injuries, provided she will release the City of Orangeburg from any future claim pertaining to this accident.

On June 15, 1960 you wrote asking that the City Council consider certain recommendations relative to the policies and procedures for the operation of the Zimmerman Youth Center. Subsequently Miss Blackmon, Councilman in charge of the Recreation Program, and I met with you, Dr. Parler and others to try to clear up the apparent confusion in this matter. Still later you again submitted recommendations, substantially the same as those of June 15th.

This situation has been carefully reviewed by City Council and the Council has determined as follows:

- On October 1, 1960 the Youth Center be placed under the City's Recreation Director as an integral part of the City Recreation program and operated in a like manner to the Middleton Street Center.
- 2. The Assistant Director, presently Mr. Jarvis, will be responsible to the Director for the operation and maintenance of the Center.
- 3. No membership fees will be charged children using the Center.
- 4. The City will continue to pay the Youth Center Supervisor, who was employed on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee.
- 5. In accordance with the original proposal of the Panhellenic Council the City expects the Advisory Board to continue to function and to assist in the planning and execution of a program of activities for the Center.
- 6. The City solicits the full cooperation of the Advisory Board, the Panhellenic Council and all other interested parties in making the Youth Center a model recreation project for the youth of the community.
