Mimutes of the regular meeting held December 7, 1965 read and approved.

A motion by Mayor Pendarvis, Seconded by Councilman Sifly and unanimously approved, the revision of Sunnyside Cemetery Regulations, effective January 1, 1966.

(See Rules and Regulations of Sunnyside Cemetery and Hebrew Benevolent Cemetery attached to and made a part of these minutes.)

City Council unanimously approved rules, regulations and procedures for the Fire Department as outlined in booklet form by Chief Gillam at the December 7th, 1965, meeting.

The City Administrator advised Council that he had received bids on two trucks for Public Works Department. Motion by Councilman Brown, Seconded by Mayor Pendarvis and approved by Council, lowest bid was awarded to Wannamaker Motor Company for \$ 2,209.35.

The City Administrator read to Council a petition from Mrs. Lurline Livingston and a petition from the Estate of Mr. J. M. Albergotti and Mrs. Dorothy S. Brown, regarding annexation of property into the City of Orangeburg. A motion by Councilman Sifly, Seconded by Councilman Brown was unanimously approved and passed first reading by title -

* AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX PROPERTY WEST OF CAW CAW SWAMP INTO THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG".

The City Administrator read a letter from Mr. D. C. Shirley, Jr. requesting sewer service for Corona Park Sub Division. Request denied. City Administrator and Director of Public Works to make a study of city sewage system at some future date.

A Resolution was unanimously approved by city council authorizing Mayor Pendarvis to sign a deed conveying right of way easement for street off Sprinkle Avenue to South Carolina Highway Department. (See Resolution attached to and made a part of these minutes)

Annual Report of City of Orangeburg was received by Council and the City Administrator was authorized to have condensed reports printed from the annual report.

Financial Report for the month of November 1965 received.

The City Administrator Stevenson announced the retirement of City Clerk and Treasurer L. F. Theiling, effective December 31, 1965. A motion by Councilman Brown, Seconded by Councilman Limehouse was unanimously approved directing City Administrator Stevenson and City Attorney Henry Sims to prepare a resolution expressing the city's appreciation to L. F. Theiling for his many years of services.

A motion by Mayor Pendarvis, Seconded by Councilman Sifly was unanimously approved by Council appointing M. R. Campbell City Clerk and Treasurer effective January 1, 1966.

A Motion by Councilman Sifly, Seconded by Mayor Pendarvis approved the purchase of a Schramm Pneumatractor from Goodlet Equipment, Inc., Cayce, S. C. for \$4,665.00. This price includes freight and Sales Tax.

SUNNYSIDE CEMETERY

The following rules and regulations shall apply to the operation and maintenance of Sunnyside Cemetery and Hebrew Benevolent Cemetery:

- 1. The Park Director shall be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the property.
- 2. The City Clerk and Treasurer shall act as Secretary and Treasurer and shall make and record all collections and disbursements in connection with the conduct and operation of the cemetery.

SOUTHEAST DIVISION

(Old Section As Per Plat of February 5, 1957; Less Section 8)
All Lots in This Division Sold

Perpetual Care Optional

- (1) Lots purchased shall be subject to all provisions and regulations as herein set forth.
- (2) No interment or disinterment will be allowed on any lot except by a licensed mortician and with the consent of the lot owner, or his or her nearest of kin, and also the consent of the cemetery officials.
- (3) All sales or transfers of lots shall be made through the office of the Secretary and Treasurer. Likewise, all charges for interment, disinterment and lot care shall be payable in advance at said office of Secretary and Treasurer.
- (4) A service charge of Twelve (\$12.00) Dollars per year, payable in advance on April 1st of each year will be made for the annual upkeep of each standard 8 grave lot. Half lots of 4 graves will be serviced upon the payment of a service charge of Six (\$6.00) Dollars per year in advance.
- (5) Perpetual care may be purchased on any standard-sized lot upon the payment of the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars. This amount will be held in trust and the interest accruing thereto will be used annually for the upkeep of the lot. Perpetual care on other than standard-sized lots shall be based in proportion, depending on size. The cost for perpetual care of half lots will be One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars.
- (6) No lot shall be filled above the established grade, nor shall grave mounds be allowed.
- (7) Use of rough field stones and brick or wooden edging for outlining lots or graves will not be permitted.

- (8) No cradles, copings, fences or other enclosures will be permitted.
- (9) All monumental work shall be constructed of no other material than cut stone or real bronze. Artificial makeshifts and unsightly objects will not be allowed. Special permission for the erection of mausoleums shall be secured only after submitting plans and specifications and contemplated location of the proposed structure to cemetery officials.
- (10) Foundations for all monumental work shall be of a first-class standard concrete mixture and all foundations for either markers or monuments shall be installed only by the duly employed caretakers of Sunnyside Cemetery. Certain fixed charges, based on the sizes of the monumental work to be erected, will be made for the installation of all foundations. These charges shall be payable in advance to the Secretary and Treasurer unless satisfactory credit rating is established. Specifications of monumental work to be installed shall be submitted at least ten (10) days in advance of actual installation in order that ample time may be had for pouring of necessary foundations. Cost of foundations will be 2.00/ cubic foot.
- (11) Every foundation must be at least as wide and as long as the base stone that will rest upon it, and must not project above the surface of the ground. Also, every foundation must extend as low as the bottom of the grave, or in such manner as shall be prescribed by the custodian of the cemetery property.
- (12) Monumental dealers will be required to comply with City License regulations before undertaking any work on the cemetery property.
- (13) The proper pruning of any trees and shrubs or the removal of any diseased or dead plant shall be done at the discretion of the cemetery officials.
- (14) It shall be within the right and authority of governing officials of the cemetery to alter any walks or drives and make such disposition of the same as they deem proper in promoting the general welfare of the cemetery.

Perpetual Care

The Northwest section has been planned for sale of lots under perpetual care only. The entire section will be developed as a lawn area, with ample,

yet a minimum, number of drives and will be attractively landscaped. All regulations heretofore set forth for the Southeast Division (except charges) shall also apply to this area and in addition thereto, the following rules and restrictions will apply to this area only:

- (1) All lots will be marked at each corner with a suitable marker which will be set on a level with the existing grade of the lawn; and in no case will copings, fences or other enclosures be permitted.
- (2) Only one (1) monument will be permitted on each lot and this must be placed in the center of the lot or as otherwise directed by the custodian in charge.
- (3) Grave markers shall be of cut stone of the following dimensions: $2 \text{ ft.} \times 1 \text{ ft.} \times 6 \text{ in.}$ and shall be set not over 6 inches above ground level.
- (4) Where single grave space is purchased, no monument will be allowed, but a marker, as specified in paragraph No. 3 above, will be permissible.
- (5) No trees, shrubs or other plants shall be planted on any lot in this section without the approval of the cemetery officials.

The prices of lots shall range from \$100.00 to \$200.00 in the Southeast Section, without perpetual care. (Sold out)

The prices of lots in the Northwest Section, with perpetual care, shall range from \$200.00 to \$400.00.

Single grave space, \$35.00; Infant grave space, \$12.50. Interment charges, \$20.00; Infant interment, \$5.00.

HEBREW BENEVOLENT CEMETERY

Regulations herein set forth for the Southeast Division shall also govern the management of the Hebrew Benevolent Cemetery.

Further information in regard to Sunnyside Cemetery and Hebrew Benevolent Cemetery may be had by consulting the custodian on duty at the Cemetery or the Director of Parks and Cemetery.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the ATLANTIC COAST LINE RAILROAD COMPANY, on the third day of February, A. D. 1964, conveyed to the City of Orange burg for road purposes a strip of land containing 0.5 acre, more or less, and being shown outlined in yellow on the print attached to the said conveyance; and

WHEREAS, it has now been determined that the said property conveyed to the City of Orangeburg should have been conveyed to the South Carolina Highway Department; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, State of South Carolina, in council assembled and by authority of the same:

That the City of Orangeburg convey to the South Carolina State Highway Department, in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar, a right of way easement for the construction of a section of the State Highway from Sprinkle Avenue to near Atlantic Coast Line Spur on Road No. S-1619, County of Orangeburg, State of South Carolina, said right of way to have a width of 60 feet, that is 30 feet on each side of the center line of the Highway except where a greater width is necessary for short distances on account of large cuts or fills and drainage structures, with the provision that the easement is executed with the provision that all buildings, fences, or other obstructions now located within the right of way herein to be conveyed, but outside the actual lines of construction, are not to be removed until such a time as the Highway Department may deem it necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That his Honor, Mayor E. O. Pendarvis, be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to execute the said Right of Way Easement on behalf of the City of Orangeburg.
