City Administrator advised council that no opposition was expressed at a public hearing regarding zoning the area annexed to the City of Orangeburg, S. C., on January 18, 1966. A motion by Councilman Brown, Seconded by Councilman Limehouse, passed first reading by Title, zoning this area as AI Residential.

City Administrator reported to Council on bids for summer uniforms for Police and Fire Departments. A motion by Councilman Limehouse, Seconded by Councilman Sifly approved and awarded the lowest bid of \$947.98 for the firemen and \$ 1,605.28 for policemen to Renneker's Inc.

City Administrator was authorized to advertise for a public hearing on rezoning to B I Business certain property on Windsor street.

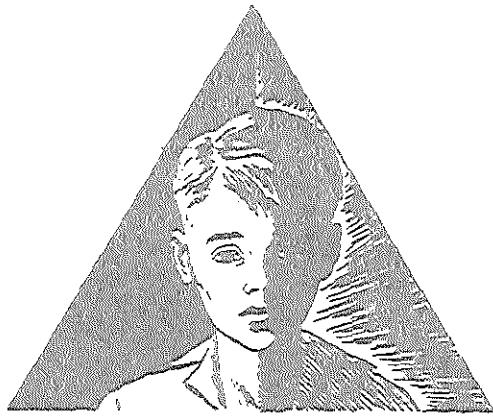

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, In accordance with Chapter 3, Title 33, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and amendments thereto, the South Carolina State Highway Department in cooperation with the Municipality of Orangenburg, proposes to construct, reconstruct, alter, or improve a certain street, or streets, on duly constituted routes in the State Highway System, within the corporate limits of said Municipality, according to plans prepared by the State Highway Department, identified as follows:

U.S. Route 21: Along St. Matthews Road Street from U.S. Route 21 & 170 Bypass, northerly to City Limits (Sta. _____).

U.S. Rt. 21 & 170 Bypass: Along Chestnut Street from City Limits (Sta. _____) near Balcon St. (St. 3-599) northerly to U.S. Route 21.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved that the Municipality of Orangenburg does hereby consent to the construction or improvements of the aforesaid municipal street, or streets, in accordance with the aforesaid plans, thereby evidencing compliance by the State Highway Department with the provisions of Section 33-172, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952; and further, the Municipality, having reviewed the plans for said construction, does hereby approve said plans, as heretofore identified, as provided for in Section 33-173, of the 1952 Code, it being understood that by such approval, the Municipality hereby assumes all liability which the State Highway Department might otherwise have as a result of damage to property or persons resulting from such improvement, construction, reconstruction, or alteration carried out in accordance with the plans herein approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality will legally protect the right of way as shown by the plans prepared by the State Highway Department and as established for this street, or streets, from future encroachment along any or all parts of the improvement covered by this agreement, and that all water and sewer pipes, manholes, or fire hydrants and all power, light, telegraph, or telephone poles will be moved, relocated or rearranged, or caused to be moved, relocated or rearranged by the Municipality, and all necessary rights of way for drainage ditches or pipes will be secured to conform to the plans for the proposed improvement and that all of the above will be

done without any expense or cost to the State Highway Department except for those items which are shown on the construction plans for this Project to be adjusted as items in the construction contract or contracts to be awarded by the State Highway Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality hereby signifies its intention to faithfully observe the provisions of Chapter 3, Title 46, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto relating to the regulation of traffic on the street, or streets, to be constructed, reconstructed, altered or improved as hereinabove identified and further agrees to refrain from placing or maintaining any traffic control devices upon any section of said street, or streets, without having first obtained written approval of the State Highway Department as required in Section 46-302 of the 1952 Code, nor enacting any traffic regulation ordinances inconsistent therewith.

Roads S-215 & S-1092

Road S-215: Along Wilson Street from Bennett Street (Road S-205) southerly to Webster Street (Road S-1240).

Road S-1092: Along Sunset Drive from Wells Drive (Road S-702) southerly to Azalea Street (Road S-902).

STATEMENT OF MAYOR E. O. PENDARVIS PERTAINING TO
REZONING OF PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE TRIANGLE
BETWEEN BOULEVARD AND ST. MATTHEWS ROAD

To me this is not the exercise of Legal Power, in so far as my part in this rezoning is concerned, but rather the fulfillment of my responsibility as an elected official.

I have given this matter long and careful thought. I have listened to all who wanted to discuss this matter with me and have sought out others who I thought had an interest. It was impossible to talk to everyone, I wish I could have.

In my opinion, the issues confronting us in this matter were - This property is privately owned, in our own United States and the owners petitioned through our Zoning Ordinance for permission to use it for business purposes, specifically the development of a shopping center. And 2 - consideration of the other citizens and its effect upon them, especially those adjacent to it on St. Matthews Road and Pecanway Terrace. In studying this matter it is shown that this is an extension of several hundred feet on the St. Matthews Road and that in my opinion those residents would have little additional effect. In fact, I think that it would be better to have a home across the street from a twenty acre shopping center than a five acre one. Also, this is an extension of business property which extends several blocks in the direction of town.

This was not an issue that everyone opposed. I had numerous people from other sections of town who favored it tell me so. And I can tell you that in your own section there were some who did not oppose it. A referendum, I would have liked, but as unpleasant as this has been for me this was my duty and to dodge it in any way would have been cowardly.

I sincerely hope that good will come from this action for all concerned.

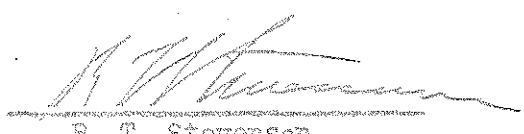

Resume of changes and additions in Aetna Life Insurance Proposal
for employees:

- (1) A change in the schedule of insurance allowing each eligible employee to purchase 1 times his annual earnings to the next highest \$1000 with an over-all maximum on any one individual of \$20,000.
- (2) A change from strictly group term insurance to group term insurance and paid-up insurance purchased by employee contributions. This would have a stabilization effect on the city cost and provide permanent insurance for the employee. If an employee's employment terminated, he would be entitled to a refund of his contributions or a paid-up policy in the amount that his contributions would buy.
- (3) An employee retiring from this city with at least 20 years service would be entitled to 50% continuation of his coverage including the paid-up insurance he has purchased with his contributions.
- (4) Long term disability income providing 60% of monthly earnings after a three-month waiting period until age 65 for either sickness or accident would be included.
- (5) Dependent's life insurance on children would be increased to a maximum of \$1000 instead of the current maximum of \$500.
- (6) The plan would be offered to those employees not now insured without evidence of insurability. This would mean that all full-time personnel of the city would be eligible to participate.

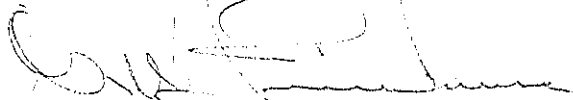

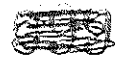
