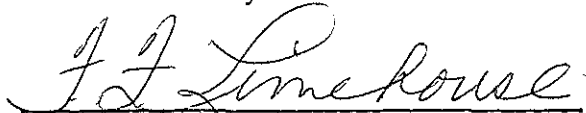
BE IT RESOLVED By the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg and by authority of the same:

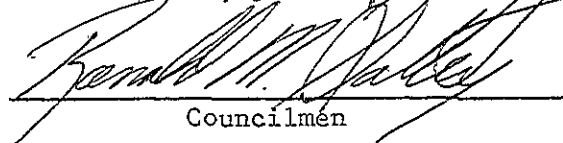

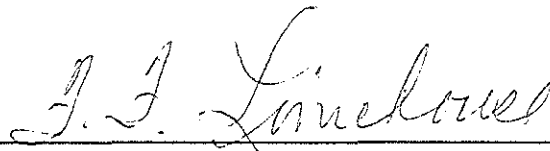
City Council approved a refund of \$12.50 to Cummings Repair Shop as the owner-operator is over 72 years of age and gross sales are less than \$ 1,000.00.

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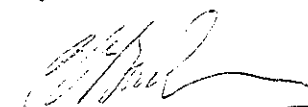

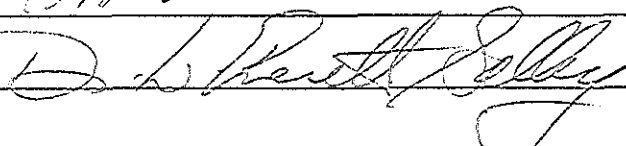

MUNICIPAL-STATE HIGHWAY PROJECT AGREEMENT

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA)

COUNTY OF Orangeburg)

FILE NO. 35.702) RESOLUTION

F. A. PROJECT NO. A-702)

ROUTE OR ROAD NO. U. S. Routes 21 & 178 By-Pass & Road S-507)

WHEREAS, In accordance with Chapter 3, Title 33, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962, and amendments thereto, the South Carolina State Highway Department in cooperation with the Municipality of Orangeburg, proposes to construct, reconstruct, alter, or improve a certain street, or streets, on duly constituted routes in the State Highway System, within the corporate limits of said Municipality, according to plans prepared by the State Highway Department, identified as follows:

<u>Project No.</u>	<u>Route or Road No.</u>
A-702	U. S. Routes 21 & 178 By-Pass & Road S-507
U. S. Routes 21 & 178 By-Pass:	Along Riverside Drive from Clover Street to U. S. Routes 301 & 601.
Road S-507:	Along Clover Street from the Seaboard Coast Line Railroad, east of Riverside Drive, westerly to Andrew Bibbie Drive (Station 19+53).

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved that the Municipality of Orangeburg does hereby consent to the construction or improvements of the aforesaid Municipal street, or streets, in accordance with the aforesaid plans, thereby evidencing compliance by the State Highway Department with the provisions of Section 33-172, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962; and further, the Municipality, having reviewed the plans for said construction, does hereby approve said plans, as heretofore identified, as provided for in Section 33-173, of the 1962 Code, it being understood that the State Highway Department shall not be liable for damages to property or injuries to persons, as otherwise provided for in Section 33-229, of the 1962 Code, as a consequence of the placing, maintenance, or removal of any utilities by the Municipality, or by others pursuant to permission of the Municipality.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality will legally protect the right of way as shown by the plans prepared by the State Highway Department and as established for this street, or streets, from future encroachment along any or all parts of the improvement covered by this agreement, and that all water, sewer and gas pipes, manholes, or fire hydrants and all power, light, telegraph, or telephone poles will be moved, relocated or rearranged, or caused to be moved, relocated or rearranged by the Municipality, in accordance with plans prepared by the State Highway Department and/or by respective utility companies showing their present

and proposed location, and made a part hereof, with provision that pole lines and hydrants be located back of the sidewalk, and all necessary rights of way for drainage ditches or pipes will be secured to conform to the plans for the proposed improvement and that all of the above will be done without any expense or cost to the State Highway Department except for those items which are shown on the construction plans for this project to be adjusted as items in the construction contract or contracts to be awarded by the State Highway Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality will furnish the State Highway Department with evidence satisfactory to the Department that the utilities are operating within the Municipality by franchise or other written permission with provision that all necessary relocations of such utilities to accommodate street improvements will be made at no cost to the State Highway Department, that the presence of the utilities over, along or under the street will in no way interfere with construction, maintenance, and safe operations of the street; and that no additional utility installations within the limits of the street improvement from the date of the execution of this agreement will be permitted without approval of the State Highway Department, and that the relocation activities will be coordinated so as to minimize interference with contractor operations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality hereby signifies its intention to faithfully observe the provisions of Chapter 7, Title 46, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962, and all amendments thereto relating to the regulation of traffic on the street, or streets, to be constructed, reconstructed, altered or improved as hereinabove identified and further agrees to refrain from placing or maintaining any traffic control devices upon any section of said street, or streets, without having first obtained written approval of the State Highway Department as required in Section 46-302 of the 1962 Code, nor enacting any traffic regulation ordinances inconsistent therewith.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, This Resolution is hereby adopted and made a part of the Municipal records this 10th day of June, 19 74 and the original of this Resolution will be filed with the South Carolina State Highway Department at Columbia.

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A RESOLUTION
PROVIDING FOR TEMPORARY BORROWING PURSUANT TO ACT NO. 116 OF THE
ACTS OF 1965, AS AMENDED, IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF
BONDS BY THE CITY OF ORANBEBURG, SOUTH CAROLINA.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
ORANGEBURG, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1.

It is hereby found and determined:

1. Heretofore, under date of July 30, 1974, arrange-
ments were made with the four banks hereinafter named to
borrow, from time to time the sum of \$1,000,000 on Bond
Anticipation Notes bearing date as of the occasion that any
loans are made, bearing interest to be determined at the time
of the first draw by the following formula: the interest
to be borne by the notes shall equal the prime rate of interest
of First National City Bank, New York, New York, plus 1% divided
by 2, provided, however, that no rate as determined by this
formula shall exceed 7-1/2% per annum, the maximum allowed
by Act No. 902 of 1970.

2. Such borrowing was arranged by reason of the
City's program to construct extensive improvements and extensions
to its Combined Public Utility System at an estimated cost
of Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000)
and the desire of the City of Orangeburg to postpone the issuance
of bonds at this time.

3. Contracts are in the process of being let for
portions of the work, making it necessary to borrow at this
time \$1,000,000, to be evidenced by four (4) Notes of \$250,000
each, numbered from 1 to 4, inclusive, to be sold to and made
payable to the order of the following banks:

American Bank & Trust, Orangeburg, S. C.

Bankers Trust of South Carolina, Orangeburg, S. C.

The Citizens and Southern National Bank of
South Carolina, Orangeburg, S. C.

First National Bank in Orangeburg, Orangeburg,
South Carolina

4. A certificate has been obtained from public accountants who examine the books and records of the City of Orangeburg relating to its Combined Public Utility System establishing the net revenues of the Combined Public Utility System of the City of Orangeburg for the two fiscal years ended September 30, 1973 and 1972 to be as follows:

1972	\$ <u>2,086,503.50</u>

5. A certificate of the Clerk and Treasurer further establishes that net revenues for the fiscal year to end September 30, 1974 will be substantially the same as those realized for the fiscal period ended September 30, 1973, making it evident that the earnings of the System will justify an issue of \$3,500,000 of bonds, bearing interest at the maximum rate permitted by South Carolina law, viz.: seven per centum (7%).

SECTION 2.

On the basis of the foregoing the City Council of Orangeburg has now determined to effect the issuance, of Bond Anticipation Notes in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,000,000, and to provide for the issuance and delivery thereof, and to draw the principal thereof from time to time, as money is needed to pay for the project.

SECTION 3.

Pursuant to Act No. 116 of the Acts of 1965, as amended, and for the purpose of raising moneys to be expended for purposes above set forth, City Council authorizes the issuance by the City of Orangeburg to the banks listed in Section 1, Paragraph 3, an aggregate of \$1,000,000 of Bond Anticipation Notes, each to be dated as of the date of issuance and all to bear interest at the rate to be determined as set forth in paragraph 1 of Section 1 of this Resolution, payable at maturity. Said Notes shall be issued in the denomination of \$250,000 each, for a total aggregate total amount of \$1,000,000. Said Notes shall be ex-

pressed to mature one year from the date thereof, but the right is hereby reserved to the City of Orangeburg to repay the Notes, both principal and interest, in full, on the date of the delivery of any bonds to be issued as aforesaid, at par, plus accrued interest to such redemption date. Said Notes shall be numbered from 1 to 4.

SECTION 4.

The proper officers of the City, viz., the Mayor and the Clerk and Treasurer, shall be and they are hereby authorized, from time to time, to execute and deliver Notes pursuant to the provisions of this Resolution, but within the limitations and upon the conditions herein expressed.

SECTION 5.

To secure the payment of the Notes, both principal and interest, so much of the proceeds of the bonds to be issued by the City of Orangeburg, as are required therefor, are hereby pledged, and the Clerk and Treasurer of the City of Orangeburg shall be duly notified of this action and directed and authorized to utilize the proceeds of said bonds to effect such payment.

SECTION 6.

In order to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the said Notes, the City of Orangeburg covenants and agrees to exercise its authorization pursuant to Sections 59-361 to 59-415, inclusive, as amended, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962, on or before the maturity date of the said Notes, and to issue and sell, pursuant to said authorization, sufficient bonds to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the said Notes.

SECTION 7.

As prescribed by Section 65-4.1, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962, the said Notes and the interest thereon are exempt from all State, County, Municipal, School District, and all other taxes or assessments of the State of South Carolina,

direct or indirect, general or special, whether imposed for the purpose of general revenue or otherwise, except inheritance, estate or transfer taxes.

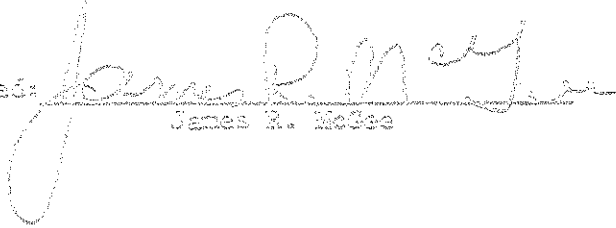

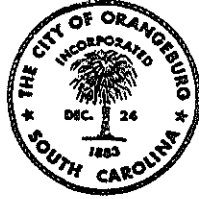

JR. AND ELIZABETH BOONE DUKES

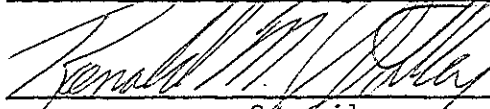
WHEREAS, The City-County of Orangeburg have agreed on a Contract

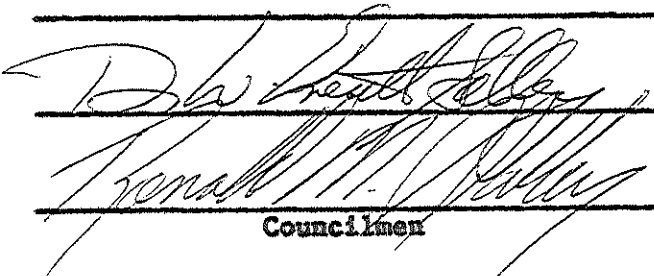
