WHEREAS, In accordance with Chapter 3, Title 33, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962, and amendments thereto, the South Carolina State Highway Department in cooperation with the Municipality of Orangeburg, proposes to construct, reconstruct, alter, or improve a certain street, or streets, on duly constituted routes in the State Highway System, within the corporate limits of said Municipality, according to plans prepared by the State Highway Department, identified as follows:

<u>Project No.</u>	<u>Route or Road No.</u>
C-	S-1009, S-1064 & S-1065
Road S-1009:	Along Maple Street from Glover Street (Road S-387) to Jackson Street (Station 10-20).
Road S-1064:	Along Dickson Street from Russell Street (Route 33) to Whitman Street (Road S-22).
Road S-1065:	Along Nancy Street from Russell Street to Whitman Street.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved that the Municipality of Orangeburg does hereby consent to the construction or improvements of the aforesaid Municipal street, or streets, in accordance with the aforesaid plans, thereby evidencing compliance by the State Highway Department with the provisions of Section 33-172, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962; and further, the Municipality, having reviewed the plans for said construction, does hereby approve said plans, as heretofore identified, as provided for in Section 33-173, of the 1962 Code, it being understood that the State Highway Department shall not be liable for damages to property or injuries to persons, as otherwise provided for in Section 33-229, of the 1962 Code, as a consequence of the placing, maintenance, or removal of any utilities by the Municipality, or by others pursuant to permission of the Municipality.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality will legally protect the right of way as shown by the plans prepared by the State Highway Department and as established for this street, or streets, from future encroachment along any or all parts of the improvement covered by this agreement, and that all water, sewer and gas pipes, manholes, or fire hydrants and all power, light, telegraph, or telephone poles will be moved, relocated or rearranged, or caused to be moved, relocated or rearranged by the Municipality, in accordance with plans prepared by the State Highway Department and/or by respective utility companies showing their present

by respective utility companies showing their present and proposed location, and made a part hereof, with provision that pole lines and hydrants be located back of the sidewalk, and all necessary rights of way for drainage ditches or pipes will be secured to conform to the plans for the proposed improvement and that all of the above will be done without any expense or cost to the State Highway Department except for those items which are shown on the construction plans for this project to be adjusted as items in the construction contract or contracts to be awarded by the State Highway Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality will furnish the State Highway Department with evidence satisfactory to the Department that the utilities are operating within the Municipality by franchise or other written permission with provision that all necessary relocations of such utilities to accommodate street improvements will be made at no cost to the State Highway Department; that the presence of the utilities over, along or under the street will in no way interfere with construction, maintenance, and safe operations of the street; and that no additional utility installations within the limits of the street improvement from the date of the execution of this agreement will be permitted without approval of the State Highway Department, and that the relocation activities will be coordinated so as to minimize interference with contractor operations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipality hereby signifies its intention to faithfully observe the provisions of Chapter 7, Title 46, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962, and all amendments thereto relating to the regulation of traffic on the street, or streets, to be constructed, reconstructed, altered or improved as hereinabove identified and further agrees to refrain from placing or maintaining any traffic control devices upon any section of said street, or streets, without having first obtained written approval of the State Highway Department as required in Section 46-302 of the 1962 Code, nor enacting any traffic regulation ordinances inconsistent therewith.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, This Resolution is hereby adopted and made a part of the Municipal records this 15th day of February, 1966 and the original of this Resolution will be filed with the South Carolina State Highway Department at Columbia.

Dear Mr. Coffey:

With reference to the improvement of the above numbered roads on the behalf of the City of Orangeburg, I wish to verify the widths of said roads as shown by map of the City of Orangeburg, said widths being as follows:

- Road S-1009: Along Maple Street 50 feet in width from Glover Street (Road S-507) to Jackson Street (Station 10+20).
- Road S-1064: Along Dickson Street 35 feet in width from Russell Street (Route 33) to Whitman Street (Road S-22) to include a radius on the right and left of approximate Survey Station 0+38 at the intersection of Road S-33 and S-1064.
- Road S-1065: Along Maxcy Street 35 feet in width from Russell Street to Whitman Street, to include a radius on the right and left of approximate Survey Stations 0+40 and on the right and left of approximate Survey Stations 15+69.

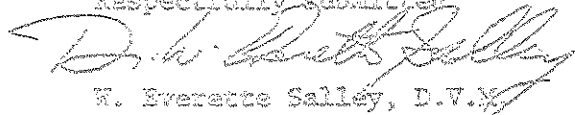
A meeting of the Law Enforcement Complex Policy Committee was scheduled to convene on Monday, February 21, 1977 at 6:30 P.M. in the Law Enforcement Complex Detention Center Conference Room. Presumably due to the holiday closing of the Post Office, most of the members of the committee did not receive their copy of the notice announcing the meeting; therefore, only the following members were in attendance:

Mrs. Mary Williams, Orangeburg County Appointee to the
Commission

In as much as the Policy Committee was supposed to determine what the criteria should be for the operating procedures for the Complex Commission to adhere to, and in the essence of time, the members of the committee who were present proposed that the Commission should discharge their responsibilities according to the following guidelines:

1. The Commission should develop an annual operating budget that shall be approved by the governing bodies of Calhoun County, Orangeburg County, and the City of Orangeburg.
2. The Commission should establish purchasing procedures and do all of the purchasing and bill the governing bodies for their respective shares.
3. The Commission should publish monthly reports regarding its financial status, and the population flow at the detention center.
4. The Commission should elect a treasurer to receive monies and pay the bills. Establish procedures to allow for and ensure that there will be an independent annual audit of the Law Enforcement Complex, copies of which are to be furnished to the three governing bodies.
5. The Commission should establish a personnel policy which would include all of the hiring and firing practices, and hiring a detention director that shall be approved by the governing bodies.
6. The Commission should be responsible for the operation of the detention center as well as the maintenance for the entire Complex facilities, which will include the grounds surrounding the building.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the South Carolina State Division of General Services, through the South Carolina State Agency for Surplus Property, by authority of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949, as amended, makes available federal surplus personal property to public agencies for public purposes and to nonprofit tax-exempt health and educational institutions, and

WHEREAS, The City of Orangeburg, hereafter referred to as the Applicant, is desirous of utilizing the services and resources of this agency, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant certifies that it is a public agency as defined by the Federal Property Management Regulations 101-44.001-10, or under Section 501 of the U. S. Internal Revenue Code of 1954, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant further certifies that property is needed and will be used by the public agency for carrying out or promoting for the residence of a given political area one or more public purposes and for no other purposes, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant agrees that all items of property shall be placed in use for the purposes for which acquired within one year of receipt and shall be continued in use for such purposes for one year from the date the property was placed in use, and in the event the property is not so placed in use, or continued to be in use, the donee shall immediately notify the State Agency, and return said property to the State Agency as directed, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant further agrees to abide by all additional periods of restriction placed on property by the State Agency; that is, 18 months on all passenger motor vehicles and other items of property with a unit acquisition cost of \$3,000 or more, except for such items of major equipment on which the State Agency designates a further period of restriction as indicated on the distribution document, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant further agrees that during the period of restriction it will not sell, trade, lease, lend, bail, encumber, or otherwise dispose of such property without prior approval of the General Service Administration or the State Agency, and in the event property is so disposed of without prior approval of the General Services Administration or the State Agency, the Applicant will be liable for the fair market value or the fair rental value of such property as determined by the General Services Administration or the State Agency, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant further agrees to remit promptly to the State Agency for all fees assessed on all property acquired for service and handling expenses, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant further agrees to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 606 of Title VI of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949, as amended, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Applicant requests that eligibility be established to participate in the Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that James R. McGee, City Administrator be authorized to act on behalf of the governing body of the Applicant in acquiring federal surplus property and so obligate said governing body to the aforementioned certifications and agreements, and that such person be authorized, at his discretion, to further delegate authority to any employee of the Applicant organization for the purpose of acquiring surplus property for use by the Applicant organization.
