

To regulate licenses in the City of Orangeburg S.C. for the Fiscal Year beginning April 1, 1933 and ending March 31, 1934.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg S.C. in Council Assembled, that every person Firm, Company or Corporation engaged in or intending to engage in any trade, business or profession hereinafter mentioned, or keeping an office or place of business open for the same, shall obtain on or before the 4th day of May, 1933, license therefor in the manner hereinafter prescribed. Every person, firm, company or corporation, commencing business after the first of April 1933, shall obtain a license therefor before entering upon such trade, business or profession.

SECTION. 2. That every person, firm or corporation or Company liable for any license under this ordinance and failing to obtain such before May 4 1933, as provided in section 1 ( except a new business ) shall pay in addition to the amount of the license Ten (10) per cent, for every month or part of a month until said license is paid thereon, as a penalty for such failure. Provided, that after the 15th day of May, 1933, all delinquents shall be reported by City License Collector to the recorder, to be dealt with in accordance with Section 4 of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. Every person, firm, company or corporation required by this ordinance to obtain a license to engage in any trade, business or profession for which a license is required, shall make an application therefor to the City Clerk and Treasurer and shall give:- First his or her name or style, and in case of a firm or company the names of the several persons constituting such firm or company; Second the trade business or profession for which a license is required; Third, the place where such trade or profession is to be carried on; and in case of dealers in goods, wares or merchandise, druggists, dealers in carriages, wagons, buggies, automobile Automobile trucks, motorcycles, bicycles, other than their own Manufacture Dealers in Pianos, organs, phonographs, radios, and other musical instruments, the application shall be in writing and sworn to, which shall state also the amount, extent and value of business carried on and their gross sales or receipts for previous fiscal year, all of which and answers to questions relative to which shall be given under oath. And in all cases the City Council, the recorder or City Clerk and Treasurer may require the production of the applicants books of accounts and sales for the preceeding year. Nothing herein contained shall in any manner affect any other requirement of trade, business or profession.

SECTION 4. If any person or persons shall carry on any trade, business or profession or shall keep an office or place for such business for the exercising, carrying on or doing of which a license is required by this ordinance without taking out such license as in <sup>that</sup> behalf is required, he, she or they, shall for every offence be subject to a penalty of not exceeding One Hundred (100) Dollars, or to be imprisoned with or without labor, not exceeding thirty days, as may be adjudged by the Recorder, or acting Recorder Trying the case.

SECTION 5. The license granted under this Ordinance shall not authorize the person or persons, (except Lawyers, Physicians, Dentists Auctioneers, Insurance and Real Estate Dealers ) or Company, Firm or Corporation mentioned therein, to exercise or carry on any trade, business or profession specified in in such license in any other place than mentioned therein, and every Firm, person, or corporation, exercising or carrying on any trade , business or profession, or doing any act for which a license is required, shall keep said license at all times in a conspicuous part of the business place, and on demand of any authorized official of the City Government shall produce such license; and unless he shall do so shall be deemed to have no license,

SECTION 6. It shall be the duty of the City License collector and policemen of the City of Orangeburg to detect and report all parties failing to take out licenses herein required. The City License Collector shall visit each and every place of business from time to time after the 15th day of May, 1933, and ascertain and report immediately to the City Clerk, Mayor or Acting Mayor, or Recorder, the names, <sup>and</sup> places of business of all persons failing to take out license and especially transients and parties recently arrived in the City who may be engaged in any business for which a license is required,

SECTION 7. If any person or persons shall desire to remove from the house or premises in which the trade, business or profession mentioned in said license, is authorized, upon application to City Clerk and Treasurer, the said City Clerk and Treasurer may transfer said license by endorsement in writing on said license to any other place ~~or business~~ or premises to conduct the same, business or profession.

SECTION 8. No license shall be issued to extend beyond March 1, 1933. The City Clerk and Treasurer is authorized to transfer licenses ONLY when said business, person or firm possesses or purchases same business for which such license was originally issued.

Section 9. All licenses for the year granted in accordance with this ordinance shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1933, and no license except as provided for by limitation , per diem or month, shall be issued for less time or rate than specified in this Ordinance, and the City Clerk and Treasurer shall prepare a proper form to be used each case.

SECTION 10. Application for licenses of all kind shall be made to City Clerk and Treasurer, all fees for same shall be paid to him in advance: and in any case where license fees may be paid to license collector, or any policemen of the City, he shall report the same to the City Treasurer at once and license shall be issued.

SECTION 11. The amount to be charged for license for any other business, profession or occupation, not herein specifically mentioned shall be fixed by the Mayor with consent of City Council, but the Mayor shall have no authority to change or reduce the License fees herein fixed. Provided:- that in case of a short term license taken out in the latter part of the Fiscal year , the Mayor may in his discretion reduce the license fee. But no reduction shall be made before January 1, 1934

SECTION 12. For the purpose of this ordinance each business or occupation herein separately and specifically mentioned and unnumbered, shall be deemed to be separate and distinct business or occupation and the payment of a license for any business or occupation herein mentioned and enumerated shall not be held to include or embrace the license for any other business or occupation herein mentioned and enumerated, unless so, specified in this Ordinance.

SECTION 13. The City Council reserves the right to revoke any license for any cause which may seem <sup>to be</sup> just. and any person or persons, firm or corporation engaged in business in the City of Orangeburg S.C. holding a license from said City who shall be convicted of the illegal or unlawful sale of any spirituous or intoxicating liquors, in violation of the City Ordinance or laws of the State, shall immediately forfeit his license for whatever business such person, firm or corporation shall be engaged in.

SECTION 14. for a license to carry on any trade, business or profession hereinafter mentioned, the following sums shall be paid to the City Clerk and Treasurer, excepting only those exempt under the laws of the State of South Carolina or the laws of the United States of America. Viz:

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT SURFACE TOILETS WITHIN THE CITY OF ORANGE-  
BURG AND TO REQUIRE, IN LIEU THEREOF, PIT-TYPE TOILETS, TO  
PROVIDE FOR THE INSPECTION THEREOF AND PENALTIES FOR  
VIOLATION HEREOF.

SECTION I. THAT from and after the passage of this ordi-  
nance the use, maintenance and construction of surface toilets  
within the City of Orangeburg is prohibited; provided, that the  
Board of Health of the said city may authorize the use of sarface

adequately protected than by the use of other types.

SECTION II. That nothing in this ordinance shall be con-  
strued as prohibiting the use of pit-type surface toilets, when  
constructed under the supervision and direction of the Board of  
Health and in compliance with all health regulations.

SECTION III. That it shall be the duty of the Board of  
Health to provide for the regular inspection of all pit-type sur-  
face toilets and that an annual inspection fee of One (\$1.00) Dol-  
lar shall be paid on or before April 1st of each year, which in-  
spection fee shall be in lieu of sanitary dues now collected; that  
the inspection fees thus collected shall constitute a special fund  
to be used by the Board of Health in protecting the health and  
sanitation of the city, especially in relation to the maintenance,

AN ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE OWNERS OF DAMAGED STRUCTURES TO REMOVE DEBRIS AND CLEAN UP PREMISES WITHIN A REASONABLE TIME AFTER NOTICE, AND TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF. ✓

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in Council assembled and by authority of the same:

SECTION I. THAT from and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for the owner of any building, or structure, which has been damaged by fire, or otherwise, to such an extent as to be unfit for continued and further use or occupation in substantially the same manner in which it was used or occupied prior to being damaged, to permit the said damaged building or structure to remain except for so long a time as may be necessary to remove the debris from the premises.

SECTION II. That the owner of any damaged building or structure, as aforesaid, is hereby required, upon receiving notice from the Building Inspector of the City of Orangeburg, to remove said debris and clean up the premises affected within a reasonable time, unless said building or structure is actually under repair; that the said notice shall give to the owner a definite number of days in which to comply and the said time given will be considered to have been accepted as a reasonable time by the owner, unless within five (5) days of receiving such notice an appeal shall be made to the City Council.

SECTION III. That should an appeal be made to the City Council by any owner, then and in that event the council shall hold a public hearing, receive testimony as to the facts from those interested, and fix such time as may be reasonable under the circumstances involved.

SECTION IV. That each day that such damaged structure or building shall remain on the premises affected in violation of the terms of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION V. That any person violating the terms of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction therefore before the Recorder, or acting recorder, be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SECTION II. THAT any person violating the terms of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction therefor, before the Recorder, or acting recorder, be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days, with or without labor upon the public works.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A LICENSE TAX ON BANKRUPT SALES, INSOLVENCY SALES, AUCTION SALES AND FIRE SALES, AND PROVIDING FOR THE MANNER IN WHICH SAME SHALL BE CONDUCTED AND DEFINING BANKRUPT STOCK, STOCK OF AN INSOLVENT, AUCTION SALES, AND FIRE SALES, AND PROVIDING FOR A BOND FOR THE PROPER CONDUCT OF SUCH SALE AND GUARANTEEING GOOD FAITH IN THE HANDLING THEREOF. ✓

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, S. C., in council assembled and by authority of the same:

SECTION I. Every person, firm, or corporation who shall take over or become the owner of or manager of any bankrupt stock of merchandise or stock of merchandise of an insolvent, or fire stock of merchandise, or wares which have been damaged or claimed to have been damaged by fire or purchased on account of any fire, and who shall thereafter offer the same, or any portion of the same for sale to the public in a manner commonly known as a "bankrupt sale" or in the manner commonly known as an "insolvency sale," or in a manner commonly known as a "fire sale," or under any other designation, shall, before offering said merchandise for sale to the public, pay a special license tax in an amount equal to five (5%) per cent of the invested capital, paid to the assignee, receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, or other person, firm, or corporation from whom said stock of goods was acquired.

SECTION II. The terms "bankrupt stock" and "stock of an insolvent" as defined herein shall be held to include any stock of goods, wares, merchandise, furniture, fixtures, jewelry, or personal property of any nature acquired from the trustee or referee in bankruptcy, a receiver or assignee, and this ordinance shall apply whether the person, firm, or corporation actually conducting the said sale acquired the said stock of goods, wares, merchandise, furniture, fixtures, jewelry, or personal property from the trustee, referee, receiver, or assignee or from any person, firm, or corporation, if the said stock is offered to the public in the manner herein described at any time within six months from the date title passed out of the referee, receiver, trustee, or assignee or other person or corporation, and shall include any stock of goods, wares, merchandise, furniture, fixtures, or jewelry which shall be sold or offered for sale any other way than through the usual channels of trade.

(b) The term "fire stock" as defined herein shall be held to include any goods, wares, furniture, fixtures, jewelry, or merchandise which are or have been damaged by fire and/or which are

or have been claimed to have been damaged by fire and/or which are or have been or which are claimed to be or have been sold or purchased on account of fire.

(c) "Selling at auction" or "auction sale" shall mean the offering for sale or selling of personal property to the highest bidder, or offering for sale or selling of such property by the method known as "down hill selling." By "down hill selling" is meant the first offering of an article at a higher price and then offering the same at successive lower prices.

SECTION III. Before any person, firm, or corporation shall, within the City of Orangeburg, conduct any sale of goods, wares, furniture, fixtures, jewelry, merchandise, or personal property of any nature as above defined, such person, firm or corporation shall file in the office of the City Clerk and Treasurer of Orangeburg, an inventory of same, duly sworn to, setting up the quality, quantity, kind or grade of the item or items thereof, to which inventory there shall be attached an affidavit that same is in all respects true and correct. In case of an individual, such affidavit shall be made by him as such, and in the case of a firm, shall be made by one of the partners, and in the case of a corporation shall be made by the president or general manager, or secretary or treasurer. Such inventory and affidavit shall be kept on file as part of the public records of the City Clerk, and it shall be unlawful for said person, firm, or corporation to add to the said stock or merchandise, goods, wares, furniture, fixtures, jewelry, or property from any source whatsoever and advertise the same as a bankrupt stock or as an insolvent stock or as a fire stock or to offer for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, furniture, fixtures, jewelry, or personal property along with same or in the same building which were not a part of the original bankrupt stock or insolvent stock or fire stock.

SECTION IV. If the stock of merchandise shall consist in whole or in part of any diamonds, or any other precious or semi-precious stones, or imitations thereof, watches, clocks, jewelry, glassware, oriental rugs, bric-abrac, or like merchandise, the same shall not be offered for sale or be sold unless there is securely attached to each of said articles a tag, or label, upon which shall be plainly written or printed in English, a true and

correct statement of the kind and quality of the metal or material of which such article is made or composed, and if of metal the percentage or character, or purity of such metal, and in case such articles are plated or overlaid, then such a tag or label shall contain a true statement of the kind of material or metal covering; and when precious or semi-precious stones are offered for sale or sold, such written statement shall set forth the true name, weight, quantity, and fineness of said stones and imitations shall be described as such, and when watches and clocks are sold, the true name of the manufacturer shall be stated in writing and no part of the movement or mechanism thereof shall be substituted or contain false or misleading names or trade marks, neither shall second hand or old movements be offered for sale in new cases without a true statement to that effect. Such tag or label shall remain securely attached to any article of merchandise and shall be delivered to the purchaser as a true and correct description and representation of the article sold and shall be deemed prima facie evidence of intent to defraud in case such written statement is not true and correct.

SECTION V. No person, firm or corporation shall sell or offer for sale, by auction or at auction sale, any of the articles of property or merchandise mentioned in the preceding section irrespective of how or when acquired between the hours of five o'clock P. M. and eight o'clock A. M.

SECTION VI. In addition to paying the tax as above provided, every person, firm, or corporation conducting a bankrupt sale, insolvency sale, fire sale, or auction sale, as herein provided, shall, before commencing said sale, file with the Clerk of the City of Orangeburg, a good and sufficient bond in the some of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, to be approved by the City Clerk, to the effect that such person conducting said sale will not mislead the public by any false or untrue advertising, or by holding back and not offering for sale any part of said stock, or by snipping in or bringing in from other sources, goods or merchandise in such manner as the public may be led to believe that such additional goods, merchandise, so shipped in or brought in, were part of the original stock, and to the further effect that such person so con-

ducting said sale will not, in any manner mislead, cheat, or defraud, or attempt to cheat, mislead, or defraud the public in the conduct of the said sale.

SECTION VII. That on the failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, or on violating its terms, the offender, on conviction thereof, in the Municipal Court, shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days for every such offense, and each day that such sale or business is conducted in violation of the terms of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION VIII. The provisions of this ordinance shall not extend to judicial sales, sales under execution, or to bona fide executor's or to administrators' sales, nor sales at auction where merchandise is turned over to a bona fide creditor or association of creditors to be sold for the benefit of such creditor or creditors.

SECTION IX. The provisions of this ordinance shall be cumulative and shall not operate to repeal any ordinance or part of ordinance not in conflict with the provisions thereof.

SECTION X. That if any part of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, such shall not invalidate any other part thereof.

SECTION XI. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION XII. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO MISREPRESENT FIRE SALES, WRECK SALES, BANKRUPT STOCK SALES, CLOSING OUT OR GOING OUT OF BUSINESS SALES, FAKE OR FRAUDULENT SALES, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in council assembled and by authority of the same:

SECTION I. Any person, firm, or corporation, or agent, advertising by newspapers, radio, posters, or otherwise, representing that they are operating, offering or maintaining "fire sales," "wreck sales," "bankrupt sales," "closing out sales," or "going out of business sales" and similar businesses, whereby the public is led to believe that they are being offered merchandise at reduced rates on account of "fires", "wrecks," "bankruptcies," "closing out or discontinuance of business," when in fact said sales are not bonafide, but are fakes and frauds, and the advertisements and representations are untrue and false, shall be held to be guilty of an offence and of a breach of orderly and proper conduct and shall, on conviction thereof in the Municipal Court, be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days for every such offense, and each day that such sale or business is conducted in violation of the terms of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION II. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE TO RAISE SUPPLIES AND MAKE APPROPRIATION TO MEET THE LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG S.C., FOR THE YEAR COMMENCING APRIL 1, 1933, AND ENDING MARCH 31, 1934.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG S.C., in council assembled and by authority of the same:-

SECTION 1. That for the purpose of raising supplies and meeting the ordinary expenses of the City of Orangeburg S. C. for the fiscal year commencing April 1, 1933 and ending March 31, 1934, a tax of ELEVEN AND FIVE-EIGHTHS MILLS (11 5/8 mills) be and the same is hereby levied on each dollar of the assessed value of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg, S. C., except such as is exempt by the Laws and Constitution of South Carolina from taxation.

SECTION 2. That for the purpose of paying the interest and creating a sinking fund for the sewer bonds, dated Jan. 1, 1907, of the city of Orangeburg, a tax of seven-eighths (7/8) of one mill is hereby levied upon the assessed value of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg S. C. except such as is exempt from taxation.

SECTION 3. That for the purpost of paying the interest and creating a sinking fund for the Water and Light bonds of the city of Orangeburg S. C., issued in accordance with an Act of the General Assembly of South Carolina, approved March 2, 1896 and acts amendatory to the same, a tax of two-eighths (2/8) of one mill is hereby levied upon the assessed value of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg S. C. except such as is exempt from taxation.

SECTION 4. That for the purpose of paying interest and creating a sinking fund for the city of Orangeburg S. C. Water and Light Extension Bonds, (Issue of 1915), issued in accordance with law, a tax of one mill (1 mill) is hereby levied upon the assessed value of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg S. C., except such as is exempt from taxation.

SECTION 5. That for the purpose of paying the interest and creating a sinking fund for the redemption of the following Bonds issued by the City of Orangeburg, according to law, dated January 1, 1920:-  
To Wit:-

100.000	Street Improvement bonds
45.000	Electric Extension bonds
45.000	Water Extension bonds
10.000	Sewer Extension bonds

a tax of Five (5) mills is hereby levied upon the assessed value of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg except such as is exempt from taxation.

SECTION 6. That for the purpose of paying the interest and creating a sinking fund for the redemption of the following bonds, issued by the city of Orangeburg, S. C., according to law dated April 1, 1921, a tax of Six and four-eighths (6 4/8) mills is hereby levied upon the assessed value of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg, S. C. except such as is exempt from taxation.  
To Wit:-

160.000	Street Improvement Bonds
40.000	Sewer Extension Bonds

SECTION 7. That for the purpose of paying the interest on \$171,000 City of Orangeburg S. C. Street Improvement Bonds, Serial a tax of Four (4) mills is levied upon the assessed value of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg S. C., except such as is exempt from taxation.

SECTION 8. That for the purpose of paying the interest and retiring Five thousand Dollars of City Municipal Building Bonds in amount \$155,000, dated April 15, 1927, a tax of Five and Six-eighths (5 6/8) is hereby levied upon the assessed value

of all real and personal property within the City of Orangeburg S. C. except such as is exempt from taxation.

SECTION 9. Tax levied under this ordinance shall be due and payable at the office of the City Clerk and Treasurer in the municipal building of the City of Orangeburg from the 16th day of October, 1933 to the 23rd day of November 1933, from the hours of 9 A.M. to 2 P.M. (Sundays excepted).

After November 23, 1933, a penalty of Fifteen Per Cent shall be added to all unpaid taxes, together with all costs incident to the collection of the same.

SECTION 10. That for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this ordinance, the City Clerk and Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered and directed to take such steps and do all things as may be necessary thereto as is provided by law and ordinances of City of Orangeburg, S. C.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE PUBLIC HEALTH BY PROHIBITING THE CREATION, MAINTENANCE OR CONTINUATION OF ANY CONDITION, SITUATION, CIRCUMSTANCE OR OBJECT WHICH WILL PERMIT THE HOLDING OR COLLECTION OF WATER IN WHICH MOSQUITOS BREED OR MAY BREED AND TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in Council assembled and by authority of the same:

SECTION I. That from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, company or corporation to create, maintain or permit to continue any condition, situation, circumstance or object which will permit the holding or collection of water in which mosquitoes breed or may breed within the limits of the City of Orangeburg, S. C.

SECTION II. That each day that such condition, situation, circumstance or object exists in violation of Section I of this ordinance, shall be a separate offense.

SECTION III. That any person, firm, company or corporation who shall violate the terms of this ordinance shall, upon conviction therefor before the Recorder, or acting-Recorder, be fined not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days, with or without labor upon the public works.

AN ORDINANCE TO DECLARE THE PRACTICE OF SOLICITORS, PEDDLERS, HAWKERS, ITINERANT MERCHANTS AND TRANSIENT VENDORS IN GOING IN AND UPON PRIVATE RESIDENCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF SOLICITING ORDERS OR FOR SELLING OR DISPOSING OF GOODS, WARES AND MERCHANDISE WITHOUT BEING REQUESTED OR INVITED TO DO SO, A NUISANCE AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR ANYONE PERPETRATING SUCH A NUISANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN of the City of Orangeburg, in council assembled, and by authority of the same:

SECTION 1.--The practice of going in and upon private residences in the City of Orangeburg, South Carolina, by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants and transient vendors of merchandise, not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residences, for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise, and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same, is hereby declared to be a nuisance, and punishable as such nuisance as a misdemeanor.

SECTION 2.--The Chief of Police and the police force of the City of Orangeburg are hereby required and directed to suppress the same, and to abate any such nuisance as is described in the first section of this ordinance.

SECTION 3.--Any person convicted of perpetrating a nuisance as described and prohibited in the first section of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, or acting-Recorder, shall be fined not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days, with or without labor on the public works.

SECTION 4.--All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
