AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE LICENSES IN THE CÌTY OF ORANGE-BURG FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING APRIL 1, 1945, AND ENDING MARCH 31, 1946.

SECTION 1 Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, S. C., in Council assembled, that every person, firm, company or corporation engaged in or intending to engage in any trade, business or profession hereinafter mentioned, or keeping an office or place of business open for the same, shall obtain on or before the 2nd day of May, 1945, license therefor in the manner hereinafter prescribed. Every person, firm, company or corporation, commencing business after the first day of April, 1945, shall obtain a license therefor before entering upon such trade, business or profession.

SECTION 11 That every person, firm or corporation or company liable for any license under this ordinance and failing to obtain such license before May 2nd, 1945, as provided in Section 1 (except a new business) shall pay in addition to the amount of the license ten (10) per cent. for every month or part of a month until said license in paid thereon, as a penalty for such failure. Provided, that after the 15th day of May, 1945, all delinquents shall be reported by City License Collector to the Recorder, to be dealt with in accordance with Section 4 of this ordinance.

SECTION 3 Every person, firm, company or corporation required by this ordinance to obtain a license to engage in any trade, business or profession for which a license is required, shall make application therefor to the City Clerk and Treasurer and shall give: First his or her name or style, and in case of a firm or company, the names of the several persons constituting such firm or company; Second, the trade, business or profession, for which a license is required; Third, the place where such trade, business or profession is to be carried on ; and in case of dealers in goods, wares, and merchandise, druggists, dealers in carriages, wagons, buggies, automobiles, automobile trucks, motorcycles, bicycles, other than their own manufacture, dealers in pianos organs, phonographs, radios, and other musical instruments, the application shall be in writing and sworn to, which shall state also the amount, extent and value of business carried on and their gross sales or receipts for previous fiscal year, all of which, and answers to questions relative to which shall be given under oath. And in all cases the City Council, the Recorder or City Clerk and Treasurer may require the production of the applicat's books of accounts and sales for the preceding year. Nothing herein contained shall in any manner effect any other requirements of trade, business or profession.

SECTION 4 If any person or persons shall carry on any trade, business or profession or shall keep an office or place for such business for the exercising, carrying on or doing of which a license is required by this ordinance without first taking out such license as in that behalf is required, he, she, or they, shall for every offense be subject to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred (\$100) dollars, or to be imprisoned with or without hard labor, not exceeding thirty days, as may be adjudged by the Recorder, or Acting Recorder trying the case.

SECTION 5 The license granted under this ordinance shall not authorize the person or persons (except Lawyers, Physicians, Dentists, Auctioneers, Insurance and Real Estate Dealers) or Company, Firm or Corporation mentioned therein, to exercise or carry on any trade, business or professionpsecified in such licnese in any other place than that mentioned **thereon**, and every person, firm or corporation, exercising or carrying on any trade, business, or profession, or doing an act for which a license is required, shall keep said license at all times in a conspicuous part of the business place, and on demand of any authorized official of the City Government, shall produce such license, and unless he shall do so shall be deemed to have no license. SECTION 6 It shall be the duty of the City License Collector and the policemen of the City of Orangeburg to detect and report all parties failing to take out a license as herein required. The City License Collector shall visit each and every place of business from time to time after the 15th day of May, 1945, and ascertain and report immediately to the City Clerk, Mayor or Acting Mayor or Recorder, the names and places of business of all persons failing to take out license and especially transients and parties recently arrived in the city who may be engaged in any business for which a license is required.

SECTION 7 If any person or persons shall desire to remove from the house or premises in which the trade, business or profession mentioned in said license, is authorized, upon application to City Clerk and Treasurer, the said City Clerk and Treasurer may transfer said license by endorsement in writing on said license to any other place or premises to conduct the same, business or profession.

SECTION 8 No license shall be issued to extend beyond March 31, 1946. The City Clerk and Treasurer is authorized to transfer licenses ONLY when said business, person or firm possess or purchases same business for which such license was originally issued.

SECTION 9 All licenses for the year granted in accordance with this ordinance shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1946, and no license, except as provided for by limitation, shall be issued for less time or rate than specified in this ordinance, and the City Clerk and Treasurer shall prepare a proper form to be issued in each case.

SECTION 10 Applications for licenses of all kinds shall be made to the City Clerk and Treasurer, all fees for same shall be paid to him in advance; and in any case where license fees may be paid to the License Collector, or any Policeman of the City, he shall report the same to the City Treasurer at once and license shall be issued.

SECTION 11 The amount to be charged for license for any other business, trade, profession or occupation, not herein specifically enumerated shall be fixed by the Mayor, with consent of City Council, but the Mayor shall have no authority to change or reduce the license fees herein fixed. Provided; That in case of short term license taken out in the latter part of the Fiscal Year, the Mayor may in his discretion reduce the license fee. But no reduction shall be made before January 1, 1946.

SECTION 12 For the purpose of this Ordinance each business or occupation herein separately and specifically mentioned and enumerated, shall be deemed to be a separate and distinct business or occupation and the payment of license for any business or corporation herein mentioned and enumerated shall not be held to include or embrace the license for any other business or occupation herein mentioned and enumerated, unless so specified in this Ordinance.

SECTION 13 The City Council reserves the right to revoke any license for any cause which may seem to be just; and any person or persons, firm or corporation engaged in business in the City of Orangeburg, holding a license form the said city who shall be convicted of the illegal or unlawful sale of any spiritous or intoxicating liquors, in violation of the City Ordinance or laws of the State, shall immediately forfeit his license for whatever business such person, firm or corporation shall be engaged in.

SECTION 14 For a license to carry on any trade, business or profession hereinafter mentioned, the following sums shall be paid to the City Clerk and Treasurer excepting only those exempt under the laws of the State of South Carolina or the laws of the United States of America, viz: A

Provided: that in case of any person beginning a business covered by this section and who was not engaged in said business covered in this city during the previous year, such person shall pay to the City Clerk & Treasurer as license the sum of twentyfive (\$25.00) dollars at the time of beginning business and in case it shall appear at the end of the year that such license so paid is more than his gross sales and receipts would require him to pay, the Mayor may refund to him the amount so paid in excess of the amount required by this section, or give such person credit for same on license for next year. And if the gross sales are in excess of amount named then the Mayor must require daid business to pay in accordance with above requirements.

Section 16. All depots, stations or other places used by Automobile Truck Companies, for storage or other purposes, located within the City of Orangeburg, S. C., shall pay license to City of Orangeburg of One Hundred (\$100) Dollars per year.

Section 17. That each day or part of a day during which any person, firm or corporation shall do business in the City of Orangeburg, S. C., without obtaining the license herein specified, shall be deemed a separate offense and each separate offense shall be punished as prescribed in Section 4 of this Ordinance.

Section 18. It shall be the duty of the City Clerk and Treasurer to make and keep posted in a conspicuous place in his office, an alphabetical list of persons paying license under this Ordinance expiring with the current fiscal year, which shall contain the name of the person, firm or corporation, the business or occupation and amount paid for license. Section 19. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed. DONE AND RATIFIED in the City Council at Orangeburg, S. C., this 23rd day of Mafch 1945.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE KNOWN AS THE PLUMBING CODE PASSED DECEMBER 13, 1907, BY ADDING A PROVISION REQUIRING THE TREATMENT OF INDUSTRIAL WASTE, OR ANY OTHER REFUSE, DISCHARGED INTO THE SANITARY SEWERS OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, S. C., in council assembled, and by authority of the same:

SECTION L. That an ordinance known as the Plumbing Code, passed December 13, 1907, be and the same is hereby amended by adding a section, to be known as Section 26A, providing for the treatment of industrial waste or other refuse, discharged into the sanitary sewers of the said City. The said Section to read as follows:

<u>SECTION</u> 26A. Before any industrial waste, or other refuse, shall be discharged into the sanitary sewers of the City of Grangeburg it shall be the duty of any firm, company or individual discharging industrial waste or other refuse into the sanitary sewers of the City of Grangeburg to treat such waste or refuse in a manner to prevent any injury to or obstruction in the sanitary sewer system of the City; it shall also be the duty of any person, firm or corporation introducing such waste, refuse, or other matter, other than water, into the sanitary sewer system to maintain proper facilities for the adequate treatment of such waste, refuse or other matter, prior to its introduction into the sanitary sewer system, in order to prevent injury or obstruction thereto; it shall be duty of any person, firm or corporation to secure from the City of Grangeburg a permit to discharge such waste, refuse, or other matter, into the sanitary sewer system and the said permit shall be issued by the City Engineer only after inspection of the method and facilities used in the disposal or treatment of such waste, refuse or other matter.

> Reference to Effluent from Kinghan & Company Packing house entering City Sewers.

Various complaints have been made by me, and certain recomendations have been suggested by me to City Council in reference to Waste from Packing hase house Plant.

In a letter from Mr. B.P.Rice Dated June 23 Rd. 1039 State Board of Health Sanitary Engineer, he recomended certain ordinances be prepared and passed by City Councilin reference to the treatment of Industrial Waste before the waste enteres City Sewers, Also my letter to City Council of July22Nd. 1938 and April 26 Th. 1944, and letter by city Attorney Mr.Hugo S.Sims dated August 25 Th. 1944to Mr. T.G.Strange of Kingan's & Company, making complaint about the effluent or waste from Packing House discharging into City Sewers.

Nothing has been done by Packing House to eliminate this Grease and hair from discharging the RAW WASTE into the city sewers I have this past week personaly been over the Sewer lines from A.C.L.Tmunk line to Packing house, and if conditions arenot immediately corrected by Kinghan's Company the city sewers will be a complete FAILURE, and stoped up completely by GREASE. In some manholes the sewage has been overflowing on the surface of the land covering shout one and one helf acres in the on the surface of the 1snd covering about one and one half acres in the Murray land. And a manhole on the line on the East side of South Boulezard in Fair grounds the sewage had backed up eight feet, and was within four inches of overflow on the surface, Also on Packing house old twelve inch line in land of Lexington Lumber Company, a manhole about five feet in depth has now only a small opening in manhole, the walls of the manhole

are a solid mass of grease. I again inform you that if this matter of Grease from Packing house is allowed to continue, it will not be long that the sever will be completely stoped up ruined, We have removed solid chunks of grease, about two truch loads in the Adden and Murray land, I am submitting these facts to you for some consideration, as the maintenance of this particular 18 inch trunk sewer will become more and more expensive, and something should be done at once to correct this muisance.

An Ordinance to Amend an Ordinance Creating and Establishing Fire Districts in the City of Orangeburg, Passes by the City Council the /6 day of/2019/9, by defining the Boundaries of the Fire V Districts in said City, so that Sections Two and Three of the said Ordinance shall read as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, AND BY AOTHORITY OF SAME:

THAT AN ORDINANCE, ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE AND ESTABULISH FIRE DISTRICTS IN THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG, PASSED BY THE COUN-CIL FEB. 16th, 1914, BE AMENDED, SO AS SECTIONS TWO AND THREE OF THE SAID ORDINANCE SHALL READ AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 2 :DISTRICT NO. ONE SHALL EMBRACE ALL TERRITORY WITH IN THE FOLLOWING LIMITS: BEGINNING AT WEST RUSSELL STREET AT EDISTO RIVER BRIDGE, AND EXTENDING NORTHERLY TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET FROM CHE CENTER LINE OF SAID RUSSELL STREET FROM EDISTO RIVERTO THE CEN-TER OF NORTH WINDSOR STREET; THENCE RUNNING NORTHERLY ON CENTER LINE OF NORTH WINDSOR STREET TO THE CENTER OF WEST AMELIA STREET: THENCE RUNNING EASTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF AMELIA STREET TO A POINT ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) FEET OF CENTER OF NORTH BROUGHTON STREET THENCE RUNNING NORTHERLY ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) ON LINE WITH BROUGHTON STREET FROM CENTER OF AMELIA STREET: THENCE RUNNING IN A NORTHEASTERLY DIRECTION TO THE CENTER OF SUNNY SIDE STREET: THE SAID POINT LINE BEING ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) FEET NORTH OF THE CENTER OF AMELIA STREET AND PARALLEL THERETO: THENCE RUNNING SOUTH EASTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF SUNNY SIDE STREET ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) FEET TO THE CENTER OF AMELIA STREET; THENCE RUNNING NORTHEAST-ERLY ON CENTER LINE OF AMELIA STREET TO CENTER OF CENTRE STREET: THENCE RUNNING SOUTHEASTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF CENTER STREET TO A POINT, SAID POINT BEING TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET NORTH OF THE CENTER OF EAST RUSSELL STREET TO THE CENTER OF TREADWELL STREET; THENCE RUNNING NORTHERLY ON CENTER LINE OF #READWELL STREET A DISTANCE OF TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY (250) FEET, THE SAID POINT BEING FOUR HUNDRED AND FIFTY (450) FEET NORTH OF THE CENTER OF EAST RUSSELL STREET; THENCE RUNNING IN AN EASTERLY DIRECTION ACROSS PRIVATE LANDS AND CROSSING NORTH BOULEVARD AND SOUTHERN RAIL WAY TO THE CENTER OF COLLEGE AVENUE, THE SAID POINT BEING FOUR HUNDRED AND NINETY THREE (493) FEET FROM THE CENTER OF EAST RUSSELL STREET; THENCE RUNNING SOUTHERLY TO CENTER OF BRUNSON COURT; THENCE RUNNING EASTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF BRUNSON COURT, A DISTANCE OF ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY TWO (172) FEET:

THENCE RUNNING SOUTH, AND PARALLEL TO COLLEGE AVENUE AND BEING ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-TWO (172) FEET THERE FROM TO THE CENTER OF WHITMAN STREET; THENCE RUNNING WESTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF WHITMAN To A. Point STREETANDE OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) FEET WEST OF CENTER OF SOUTHERN RAIL WAY; THENCE RUNNING NORTHERLY AT RIGHT ANGLES WITH WHITMAN STREET TO A FOINT TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET SOUTH OF THE CENTER O OF EAST RUSSELL STREET; THENCE RUNNING WESTERLY THE LINE BEING BE-ING TWO HUNDRED FEET (200) SOUTH OF THE CENTER OF EAST RUSSELL STREET; TO THE CENTER OF DOYLE STREET; THENCE RUNNING SOUTHERLY ON CENTER LINE OF DOYLE STREET TO WILES STREET: THENCE RUNNING SOUTH-WESTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF WILES STREET TO CENTER OF SOUTH MIDDLETON STREET: THENCE RUNNING NORTHWESTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF SOUTH MIDDLETON STREET TO CENTER OF HAMPTON STREET; THENCE SOUTHWESTERLY ON CENTER LINE OF HAMPTON STREET, EXTENDING TO A POINT TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET WEST OF THE CENTER OF SOUTH BROUGHTON STREET; THENCE RUNNING NORTHWESTERLY AND BEING TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET WEST OF THE CENTER OF SOUTH BROUGHTON STREET TO A POINT TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET SOUTH OF THE CENTER OF WEST RUSSELL STREET; THENCE RUNNING SOUTH-WESTERLY, THE SAID LINE BEING TWO HUNDRED (200) FEET SOUTH OF THE CENTER OF WEST RUSSEEL STREET TO EDISTO RIVER, TO THE POINT OF BE-GINNING:: OF WHICH BEING SHOWN "RED" ON MAP OF THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG S.C. ON FILE IN OFFICE OF INSPECTOR OF BUILDINGS.

SECTION 3: DISTRICT NO. TWO SHALL EMBRACE ALL TERRITORY IN THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG NOT EMBRACED IN DISTRICT NO. ONE ABOVE DES-CRIBED.

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AN ORDINANCE TO PERMIT THE CONDITIONAL LICENSING OF POOL ROOMS IN THE CITY OF ORANGEBURG, S. C. AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in Council assembled and by authority of the same:

<u>SECTION I.</u> That from and after the passage of this Ordinance, it shall be lawful for the City of Orangeburg to issue a conditional license for the operation of a pool room, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance hereinafter contained, and that the license fee shall be Fifty (50) Dollars for the first table and Twenty-five (25) Dollars for each additional table, per annum.

SECTION II. The conditional license herein authorized shall be granted upon written application, specifying the location and number of tables, the names of individuals responsible for the management, operation and good conduct of the said pool room and that the said pool room be conducted at all times in accordance with such regulations as may now or hereafter be provided by the City Council by resolution and in conformance with instructions issued from time to time by the Chief of Police, or Acting Chief, of the City of Orangeburg, who is hereby specifically empowered and ordered to close any pool room upon the occasion of any disorderly or disagreeable conduct, gambling or drinking of beer or alcoholic beverages upon the premises. All such licenses will be granted and every pool room will be subject to the inspection of the police officers of the City of Orangeburg and acceptance of any license to operate a pool room will be an acceptance by the licensee of the terms of this Ordinance and such regulations as may be passed by the City Council, and an agreement by such licensee to conduct the said pool room in conformance with instructions from the Police Department. The licensee, in accepting a license under this Ordinance, shall waive any claim against the City of Orangeburg for any and all damages whatsoever, claimed or occasioned, by the closing of any licensed pool room by any police officer and acceptance of a license to operate a pool room shall automatically abthorize any police officer of the City of Orangeburg to close any pool room upon the occasion of disorderly or disagreeable conduct, gambling, or the sale, storage or drinking of beer or alcoholic beverages upon the premises and for any other cause.

SECTION III. The conditional license herein authorized is subject to the good conduct of the owner, manager, or operator of the said pool room and the maintenance of good order in the said pool room and upon the provision that

the said pool room be closed not later than eleven P. M. of each day and that no minor child, or children, under the age of eighteen (18) years shall be allowed to visit, loiter or play pool in the said pool room; it is also specifically provided that no license will be granted to any pool room not located on the first floor of any building, or to a pool room which contains blinds, curtains, particitions, or other devices which prevent clear vision of the entire pool room from the front of the building in which the said pool room is located.

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SECTION IV. It shall be the duty of the City Clerk and Treasurer, upon the receipt of an application from any person, firm or corporation, to operate a pool room, to give public notice of the application, specifying the proposed location and setting a date, not less than one week thereafter, when the City Council will pass upon the said application; the said notice shall advise any person opposed to the application to file a written protest with the Clerk and Treasurer and to appear before the City Council at the time the application is considered.

<u>SECTION V.</u> In considering and passing upon the question of granting permission to open or operate any pool room, regard shall be had by said City Council as to how the same shall be built or kept, to the avoiding or prevention of danger to pedestrians in consequence of the use of said institution, to the presence or absence of densely populated residence neighborhoods, to the question whether the proposed institution is so near to churches, schools, hospitals or other institutions to prove injurious to them, to the matter of protection against fire losses, and to the general security, welfare, convenience, health, peace, order and good government of the City.

SECTION VI. Should any section or clause of this Ordinance become invalid because of unconstitutionality, the entire Ordinance shall be void and of no effect; any Ordinance of the City of Orengeburg heretofore passed which is in conflict with this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency but only so long as this Ordinance remains in effect in its entirety.

<u>SECTION VII.</u> That any person, firm or corporation violating the terms of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction therefor before the Recorder, or acting-Recorder, be subject to a fine not exceeding Ordinance,

One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisonment with or without hard labor for not more than thirty (30) days.
