## RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, The Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in Council assembled, did on November 23, 1950 pass a Resolution authorizing Honorable R. H. Jennings, Mayor, to execute a lease agreement between the City of Orangeburg and Mrs. F. A. Adden, Mrs. L. H. Adden and Luther H. Adden, Jr. with reference to a portion of the interior of that certain block in the City of Orangeburg between Russell, Broughton, Windsor and Amelia Streets, with rights of entrance to the said area over twenty (20) foot strips of land leading from each of the said Streets, and

WHEREAS, a question arcse before the execution of the lease on the part of the Lessors that the said lease might be construed as meaning an exclusive right-of-way over the said twenty (20) foot entrance strips from the said streets and because of such question the lessors have objected to the said lease, and

WHEREAS, it was not the intention to acquire an exclusive right-of-way over the said strips of land to the said streets: but that it was understood that the lessors or any of their tenants or customers of their tenants would have the right to traverse the said twenty (20) foot strips for the purpose of ingress and egress to the rear entrances of the store buildings and houses located in the said block, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Orangeburg, in Council assembled, that the proper construction to be placed upon the said lease is that the City of Orangeburg will acquire a right-of-way over the said twenty (20) foot strips of land but will not acquire an <u>exclusive</u> right-of-way over the said strips leading to the proposed parking lot from the four streets as shown on the map by A. T. Brown, City Engineer, dated August 8, 1950 and revised November 1, 1950, which said map is referred to in the said agreement and is to be considered a part thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lessors in the said lease, therein referred to as parties of the Second Part, shall have the right from time to time as they see fit to check the parking meters and records of revenue derived therefrom.
