

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-03

ACCEPTING A PORTION OF GOFF AVENUE FROM CLARK STREET TO MAGNOLIA STREET FROM THE SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; CLOSING GOFF AVENUE FROM CLARK STREET TO MAGNOLIA STREET; TRANSFERRING SUCH ROAD TO CLAFLIN UNIVERSITY; AND PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, the City Council ("Council") of the City of Orangeburg ("City") finds:

- (a) On or about January 19, 2023, the South Carolina Department of Transportation removed a portion of state road 38-106 from the State Highway System, as indicated in the attached Exhibit A;
- (b) The City intends for this Ordinance to represent the City's acceptance into the City's municipal road system so much of that portion of state road 38-106 removed from the State Highway System;
- (c) According to South Carolina Code Annotated section 5-27-150, the city council of any city containing more than five thousand inhabitants may close or alter streets in the city when, in the city council's judgment, the closure or alteration may be necessary for the improvement of the city;
- (d) According to the 2020 Decennial Census, as of April 1, 2020, the City's population is 13,240;
- (e) The Council has received and reviewed (i) numerous reports from the City's Department of Public Safety as well as the Claflin University Department of Public Safety raising significant concerns regarding the health and safety of residents of the City and students of Claflin University, (ii) video footage regarding the same, (iii) written and oral information from the President of Claflin University, and (iv) additional similar information;
- (f) The Council has reviewed and considered the proposed area for closure of Goff Avenue and abandonment of the same in favor of Claflin University, such that, (a) no traffic would be permitted to exit from Goff Avenue onto Magnolia Street or to exit from Magnolia Street onto Goff Avenue and (b) no traffic would be permitted to exit from Goff Avenue to the southeast of Clark Street left onto Clark Street or from Clark Street to the right onto Goff Avenue, but traffic would be permitted from the northeast of Clark Street on Goff Avenue to turn right onto Clark Street, as more fully depicted in the crosshatched area on Exhibit B ("Closure Area," which does on include any public right of other or other areas extending beyond the actual paved portion of the existing public street);
- (g) The Council has considered that, to the best of the Council's knowledge after inquiry, all other intersections with Goff Avenue in the Closure Area are for properties owned or operated by Claflin University; and
- (h) After weighing the information received and considering the health and safety impacts and the necessity for the closure and abandonment to ensure the City's continued improvement;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council ordains as follows:

Section 1. The City hereby accepts as a municipal road only so much of that portion of state road 38-106 removed from the State Highway System as indicated in the attached Exhibit A.

Section 2. The City hereby closes and abandons, in favor of Claflin University, the Closure Area and quits any claim the City may have in the Closure Area in favor of Claflin University, provided, however, the City reserves any and all easements and all other existing public uses, including legal access rights for any real property owners, other than Claflin University, whose property abuts Goff Avenue and including the City's ability to repair, maintain, and expand and/or extend such uses, of the Closure Area, including, for example, public utilities, and authorizes the City Administrator to execute a quit claim deed in favor of Claflin University with such reservations and such other and further documents as may be necessary and prudent to effect this Ordinance's intent, provided that by accepting the deed from City, Claflin University is required to simultaneously convey individual, perpetual access and utilities easements to, and for the

benefit of, any real property owners whose property abuts Goff Avenue, which easements shall be in recordable form.

Section 3. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to impact any proceeding inchoate or pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired, or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 4. All Ordinances, resolutions, orders, and parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance, are to the extent of that conflict, repealed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon enactment by the Council.
